**Christmas Kettles** – Ron just got this note and wanted to share it with you.

To our AMAZING Bell Ringers...

We wanted to touch base with all of you to let you know that the 2020 Christmas Kettle Campaign WILL be happening again this year, and it will start on Friday, November 13<sup>th</sup>.

With all the changes in the world right now, we want to make sure that all of you feel safe while volunteering for us. There will be numerous COVID-19 safety protocols in place, including the requirement to wear personal protective equipment (masks, etc.) which will be provided, as well as sanitization materials to clean the Kettle Stand and equipment regularly throughout the day (at the beginning/end of each shift).

Furthermore, we will unfortunately not be able to hand-out anything this year (including cards or candy canes) and aprons will not be available (as we will not be able to sanitize them between uses).

We understand that the world feels like it flipped upside down this year, and we cannot stress the urgency we feel as we move forward in this time of uncertainty. Here in Kelowna, we have seen an 61% increase in the number of individuals and families accessing our services since March of this year... and 47% of those households had NEVER come to us asking for support before. This is a CRITICAL fundraising season for us to ensure that we can continue to provide help and hope to our community for the coming year. We simply cannot thank you enough for your service.

This year we will be including a "Tip Tap" machine with each kettle, where anyone can donate simply by tapping their card on one of the three pre-set donation amounts (this is a great option for those who don't carry cash!). These machines are extremely easy to use, and no training is needed to operate.

We will be reaching out to you shortly (via email and phone calls) with schedules and locations for our 2020 Christmas Kettle Campaign (locations will be finalized in the

next week or so, and a schedule will be built after that)

If you are not able to volunteer this year as a bell ringer, we totally understand and we still have opportunities for you to be involved!


