Guidelines for Submission of Applications for International Humanitarian Projects to the International Service Committee of the Rotary Club of Kelowna Sunrise

These guidelines are to be used by the International Committee to allocate club funds in a fair and equitable way. They are to be used for member requests for international humanitarian projects that utilize funding from the club budget, District Designated Funds (DDF), and/or Global Funds from The Rotary Foundation (TRF) and used in the ranking of donation requests and their possible approval by the committee.

- 1. Submitted projects must be passionately championed by a Sunrise Rotary Club member.
- 2. It is preferable if the club member(s) has/have had the opportunity to visit the country and location of the proposed project and has/have established Rotary contacts in that location.
- 3. The club member(s) must be prepared to participate in the development and implementation of the project;
- 4. The project must adhere to the rules and guidelines of Rotary International
- 5. The project must be sustainable and must support one or more of the following six areas:

Peace and Conflict Resolution
Disease Prevention and Treatment
Water and Sanitation
Maternal and Child Health
Basic Education and Literacy
Economic and Community Development

6. There must be opportunity for the club member(s) proposing the project and other club members to visit the project site.
