

Constitution of the Rotary Club of Kelowna Sunrise

Article 1 Name

The name of this organization shall be Rotary Club of Kelowna Sunrise

Article 2 Locality of the Club

The locality of this club is as follows: The City of Kelowna, British Columbia, Canada

Article 3 Object

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster:

- *First.* The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;
- *Second.* High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations; and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;
- *Third.* The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business and community life;
- *Fourth.* The advancement of international understanding, goodwill and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

Article 4 Bylaws

This club shall adopt bylaws not inconsistent with the constitution and bylaws of RI, with the rules of procedure for an administrative territorial unit where established by RI, and with this constitution, embodying additional provisions for the government of this club. Such bylaws may be amended from time to time as therein provided.

(Note: Here in this constitution is Articles 1, 2, 3, and relocated Article 17 of the R.I. Club Constitution, which the club is obliged to adopt; the remainder of that document follows, with renumbering as needed, as Bylaws Part 1.)
