1. Provide education on the Rotary Foundation throughout the year

Strategies:

- 1.1 Organizing and presenting mini-educational features during regular meetings of the club regularly throughout the year (once per month)
- 1.2 Include educational units related to the Foundation in the Mentorship Manual
 - 1.2.1 Require that all mentors provide sufficient understanding of the Foundation to all new members and that they clearly need to support the Foundation and that the Foundation should be their first charity of choice
- 1.3 Order and post Rotary Foundation banners and posters throughout the meeting venue during the meetings of the club
- 1.4 Develop in 2014 a variety of PowerPoint slides and/or screen savers on various Foundation topics that will be highlighted on the presentation screen via the projector prior to presentations being made by guests
- 1.5 Use the club website as a tool to provide educational topics from time to time
- 1.6 Organize a major presentation during Rotary Foundation Month (November)
- 1.7 Prepare and present an illustrated overview of The Rotary Foundation and the Funding of the Foundation on September 06, 2013
 - 1.7.1 Programs of the Foundation
 - 1.7.2 The Share Concept
 - 1.7.3 The Club's 2013-14 Goals
 - 1.7.4 Brief History of the Club's Giving
 - 1.7.5 Funding the Foundation through personal donations

- 2. Develop and implement strategies that will result in increased individual donations to the programs of the Foundation
 - 2.1 Annual Fund Goal: Increase member per capita donations by 25 percent over the goal set for 2012-13 for a total of \$US8750

Strategies:

- 2.1.1 Increase the number of Paul Harris Society members
- 2.1.2 Encourage that those who have not contributed or have not contributed for some time even if they have attained a PHF in the past should become sustaining members of the Foundation
- 2.1.3 Seek approval from the Board and Executive for a plan that provides matching points of 125 to all members who have not yet started contributing to the Annual Fund provided they donate \$US125 to the Annual Fund
- 2.1.4 Develop a reusable thermometer graph to illustrate progress in the club's endeavours to achieve their Annual Fund Giving Goal which will be displayed at each Business Meeting of the club
- 2.1.5 Order and provide coin boxes labeled for all club members, collect filled boxes and then have the cash submitted to The Rotary Foundation
- 2.2 PolioPlus Fund Goal: Provide an amount of at least \$US2000 as a club to the PolioPlus Fund

Strategies:

- 2.2.1 Organize a Fund Raiser Dinner in the spring with all net profits going to the PolioPlus Fund
 - 2.2.1.1 Invite a guest Rotarian to make a presentation on the progress being made and the challenges to make the world free of polio
 - 2.2.1.2 Involve the Interact club in the planning and provision of the dinner
- 2.2.3 Accept individual donations to the PolioPlus Fund that are beyond the commitment made by Rotarians to the Annual Fund

2.3 Permanent Fund Goal: Increase the number of Rotarians of the club who will become benefactors by three and the number of Rotarians who will become Bequest Society Members by one

Strategies:

- 2.3.1 Provide an overview of the purpose of the Permanent Fund and how it operates; and include the amount accumulated in the Fund and the interest generated which is then used to support humanitarian programs around the world
- 3. Meet the criteria for District and Foundation Awards for an increase in Fund Raising for the programs of the Foundation

Strategies:

- 3.1 Increase the number of Sustaining Members to 30 members
- 4. Recognize individual Rotarians for their contributions to the various programs of the Foundation

Strategies:

- 4.1 Present awards of the Foundation at regular meetings as soon as possible following attainment of such award
- 4.2 Have all Rotarians who have received recognition for outstanding contributions to the Foundation stand up and be recognized during the meetings when specific awards are presented to the Rotarians
- 4.3 Recognize all Rotarians who have achieved Foundation achievements at the Installation Dinner of the club; but no official presentations should be made
- 5. Report regularly to the club

- 5.2 Update the club with the progress in achieving its goals during all Business Meetings
