THE LIFE Kit

Each plastic pouch contains 2 blank data forms, one fridge magnet and one decal. Once completed, these forms provide pertinent information regarding an individual's doctor, medical conditions, allergies and next of kin. Each person in the household should have a completed form in the pouch. The completed forms are to be stored in the pouch which is to be kept in the fridge in the designated location. In the event of an emergency, the LIFE Kit can be easily accessed by emergency medical personnel.

Additional helpful information, such as identification photographs and medical directives, can be optionally included in the LIFE Kit.

Who does the LIFE Kit help?

Since the pouch is used when people cannot reliably provide their own medical information, it is ideal for senior citizens, chronically ill persons and those who live alone. The information is equally important for young children under the care of a sitter.

The pouch can also be used by travelers in cars. For this purpose, the pouch is stored in the glove box.

Where to keep the LIFE Kit

The completed pouch is to be taped beneath the top shelf of the fridge on the right hand side. The pouch can also be placed at the back of the top shelf on the inside of the fridge door.

To alert emergency personnel that the LIFE Kit is available, a brightly colored fridge magnet or decal is placed on the front of the fridge door. A decal should also be placed on the entrance to the residence.
