#### Jan Damery: Building Bridges, Building Peace

Jan Damery, an economist by training with experience in TransCanada Pipelines and fundraising for United Way (she doubled the revenues in four years), developed a passion for Africa. She has taken on the role with the Aga Khan organization as the chief fundraiser.

She shared the story with us of how she brokered a unique partnership with Rotary International. Bridges that Reach the Unreached. Aga Khan University (AKU) has developed a strong relationship with downtown Calgary. This relationship, like the one with the university, has been building for five years. Over a classic Rotarian coffee, Jan Damery and Steve Allan took the initial steps to create a linkage between AKU and Rotary International.

As Preston Manning used to say in Calgary more business decisions are made and executed over a cup of coffee than you would be discussed and deferred for action in a month in Ottawa or Toronto.

The RI/AKU partnership was implemented immediately. They have started a program in East Africa, expanding to Pakistan and Afghanistan. RI is providing scholarship, mentoring and upgrading skills. Vocational training teams of five to six people are working with the faculty on clinical practice and skills for nurses and midwives. The results are maturing now. The first teams from Africa are now helping each other.

AKU and RI have focused on childbirth. Every 90 seconds another child dies of preventable disease. Educating nurses and midwives to support remote locations prevents needless death.

AKU is unique in that it is based in the developing world, not the developed world. People who are trained in the developing world stay in the developing world, staying at home to help their neighbors.
