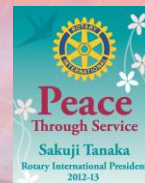

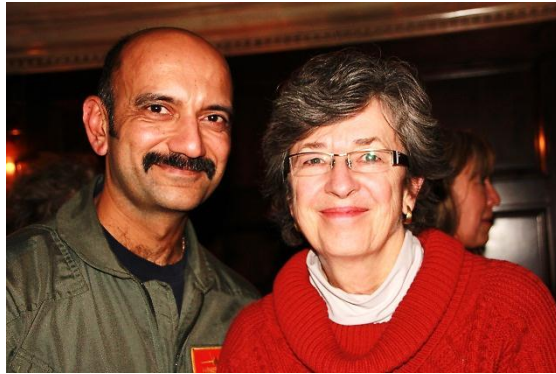
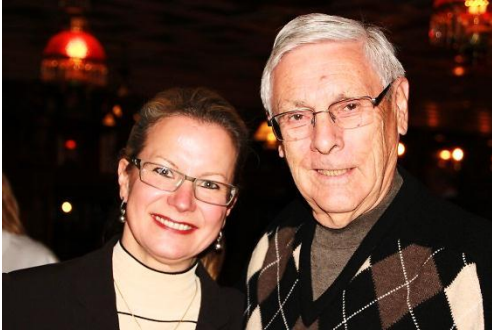
We extend our sincere appreciation to all organizations that donated prizes to the event. Through all of the evening's fundraising efforts, a healthy \$13,000 was collected so far.

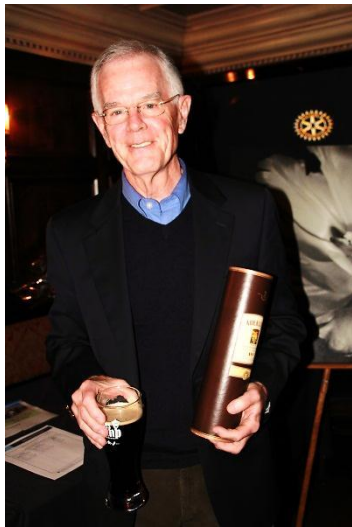
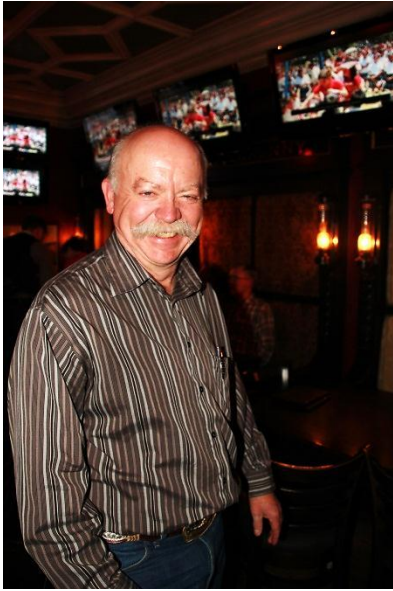

In particular, the tax on a capital gain realized on the donation of certain publicly traded securities to our qualified charity can now be eliminated. In addition to the elimination of the capital gains tax, the donor will receive a tax credit for the full value of the donation.
