

Dawn Farrell: TransAlta Utilities

Tony Howard, whose family has a long legacy with TransAlta Corporation, introduced Dawn Farrell, CEO of TransAlta, Taking her queue from Bill Avery, her talk was personal, focused and short enough to allow questions! With our meeting falling on the eleventh anniversary of 9/11, Dawn shared that she was in New York that fateful day. She and her colleagues got creative, rented a van and crossed the US Canada Border a day and a half later. She recounted how she was never so glad to step on Canadian soil - so glad that she kissed the soil and counted her blessings.

It is with similar pride that she leads TransAlta, a 100 year old Alberta company and a company that she grew up in for almost 25 years, taking a short break to work with BC Hydro. She described TransAlta and the electricity business as one that makes Alberta businesses competitive by providing reliable and cost effective power. She noted that all strong economies in the world have strong, reliable power grids. In her no-nonsense, practical way, she explained that contrary to press reports, wholesale electricity prices in Alberta have risen less than 10% in the past decade, so deregulation has not failed. She took pride in sharing the 100 year story of TransAlta, its evolution and devolution to becoming only a power generator. She also took pride in relaying how TransAlta has the largest share of renewable generated power of any power company: 2000 Mega Watts (MW) out of 9000 MW, despite the challenges of integrating wind into the grid. Unfortunately even she cannot control when and how the wind blows!

This is one of the biggest challenges with electricity - the challenge of cycling generation capacity to match peak loads. She hinted that there is some new thinking on storing electricity emerging that switches it up and focuses on how heat can be stored and later used to generate electricity and more LED lights.

All present at the meeting will rethink their Christmas lights this year. The Christmas light load is estimated at 500 MW, even with LED lights. While a single LED consumes less power, it seems in this case less is more because people are stringing more and more LED lights. To put this 500 MW Christmas load into perspective, Dawn shared that this is equivalent to the power that a \$1.2 billion gas-fired power plant generates.

She finished by setting her gaze on the future explaining that her and TransAlta's biggest challenge is ensuring future capacity to match growth in demand – growth in demand generated by Alberta's economy, and more and more the energy demands of China that are knocking at Canada and Alberta's doors.

President Doug began the meeting with a reflective moment, recounting September 11th eleven years ago and how the world has never been the same. He honoured those that had fallen – they and their families.


