Jannalee Anderson, Opportunity International

On Tuesday morning we received an email announcing that our scheduled speaker Doris Olafsen was fogged in at the Vancouver airport. Fortunately, she was able to enlist her colleague Jannalee Anderson, who happened to be arriving from Toronto, to take her place. Jannalee landed in Calgary shortly after 11:00 and raced to the Palliser to do an amazing job filling in for her. Doris is feeling a little bit cursed as her originally scheduled presentation to the club was cancelled due to the June flood!

Jannalee provided the club with an overview of Opportunity International, one of the first non-profit organizations to recognize the benefits of providing small business loans to people so they can work themselves out of poverty. Her impassioned and informative presentation expounded on the power of microfinance.

Founded in 1988, Opportunity International's loan portfolio is now in excess of \$1.1 billion made up of micro loans to small business owners who are chiefly women (93 per cent). Beyond the statistics Jannalee described her impressions of visiting a Honduran project where she saw dignity and pride on the faces of women who were using these loans to run their businesses. Opportunity International's business development model identifies determined entrepreneurs and provides them with funds, peer support, and training to ensure success. The result is that 95 per cent of these loans are repaid, and many of the entrepreneurs return for larger loans as their enterprises grow.

One success story is that of Mama Rosemary, a Ugandan who found herself caring for eleven HIV orphans. They needed schooling, and she applied for a \$204 dollar loan to provide materials for teaching in her home. Following a series of expansions, she now has five permanent buildings that house an elementary school, an orphanage for 900, and she employs 53 people. But she isn't finished yet, as she has an outstanding loan of \$7,000 being put to work. What TSE listed company wouldn't love to have a track record like that?
