Thomas Jieldit - Lost Boys of Sudan

Ralph Lundberg introduced our speaker, Thomas Jieldit, who told us about his incredible life journey. He spoke of being separated from his family as a child during the Second Sudanese Civil War, of his years as a child soldier, and of coming to Canada and completing a BA in Political Science at the University of Calgary.

Thomas was separated from his family at age 12 when troops from the north invaded the south. He found his way to Ethiopia along with thousands of other refugees, many of whom were children displaced from their families or were orphaned; their only sustenance on this long journey being foraged wild berries. Roads were littered with the dead and dying, covered with masses of green flies. The children, not having had previous experience with death, would often try to wake these bodies and shoo away the flies. Rather than finding sanctuary in Ethiopia, Thomas was forced to fight as a child soldier for a Sudanese rebel group. He escaped from the rebels after six years, and made his way to a Kenyan refugee camp. His first schooling was in this camp gathered with other children under a tree with a teacher and small chalkboard.

Twenty-three years later Thomas finally reunited with his family. He showed us a video of this emotional reunion in his home village. Thomas' father gave him a gift and words of advice. He said, "This pen is your weapon".

Thomas still can't believe what he has achieved since arriving in Calgary. He is so thankful for his freedom, and is dedicated to peace so that other children will not have to suffer as he had. He earned a degree in Political Science, specializing in African studies, and co-founded the Lost Boys and Girls of Sudan. He and his wife are now raising three children, and is making a difference by promoting peace and reconciliation. In referring to this, left us with the sage adage, "Where two bulls fight the grass suffers".

Thomas was given one of our rare standing ovations, and Madeleine King presented him with a CAWST certificate acknowledging our donation made in his honour. She also urged Thomas to apply for a Rotary Peace Scholarship.
