### SOUP SISTERS AND BROTH BROTHERS Sharon Hapton, Founder

Our speaker, Sharon Hapton, spoke to the meeting about Soup Sisters and Broth Brothers of Calgary.

These are wonderful organizations dedicated to "warming hearts, one bowl at a time". Basically, these two groups are comprised of friends who gather to make soup together, under the auspices of respected chef facilitators, to peel, chop, grate and otherwise prepare soup for people in crisis.

Sharon and her organization have been recognized by both Chatelaine Magazine and the YWCA.



This group particularly addresses the needs of women and children. There are now 4,500 Soup Sisters and Broth Brothers who offer this practical support to twenty shelters for victims of domestic violence.

Those involved experience a wonderful, companionable meeting, and are led by celebrity chefs in producing the soups. There have been 15 soup making events producing 8,000 bowls of soup countrywide. The recipients list is filled until the end of 2012. Both Soup Sisters and Broth Brothers support women and children, while Broth Brothers specializes with young people to assist street youth to become productive, healthy members of society. Diverse, health recipes are used and those involved are taught by professional chefs to make unique and healthful soups.

The organization is 100% staffed by volunteers and the organization works on a breakeven/cost recovery basis. New volunteers are always welcome, and contact cane be made through Sharon at hapton@shaw.ca. More information is available at www.soupsisters.org.
