SUN ERGOSBob Greenwood, Founder

The introduction of our guest speaker (alone because his partner was not well) fell to our acting-Pres Bart.

Our guest, Robert Greenwood, along with his partner Dana Luebke, founded SUN ERGOS, theatre and dance company, in 1977. Each of the partners has extensive training in their respective artistic fields.



Robert (Bob) knew of Rotary from having been a first alternate Rotex student in Vermont. He was born in 1941 and in response to limited financial resources in the family, he went into the theatre (as children they were able to watch hours of movies and vaudeville for 10 cents!). At age five he told his father he wanted to be an actor and his father's response was "How do we do it?!" He went on to take voice and dance lessons and was singing on radio by age six.

He then listed his training, including a certificate from Dartmouth College as well as an MSA in acting, directing, and design. Later he was head of Artistic programs at U. of Oklahoma, and at Calgary. Some of the drive behind the creation of Sun Ergos was to teach actors "How to Act and How to get a Job".

He went on to describe their attendance at a large children's festival in Yugoslavia, and how they continued to go to this festival during the "uncivil" war in the Balkans. They made many friends and impressed them with their "crazy" behaviour in continuing to appear at the festival throughout the war years. For three years they were the only "international" group to come to what had been the largest children's art festival in the world!

The risks he described were almost surreal, and the relationships which they developed demonstrated that they lived up to their mandate "to celebrate the difference and recognize the similarities among people and cultures" (from SUN ERGOS, a Company of Theatre and Dance brochure). Bob noted that the brochure was published to celebrate their 30th year and this is now their 32nd year of acting and dancing.

Bart presented a certificate from the club ... a donation to PolioPlus to recognize Bob for his presentation.


