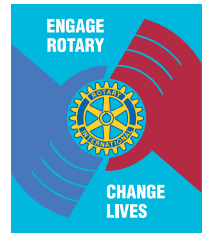

THAILAND

Cole Demorest, 2012/13 Exchange Student

Orion introduced Cole Demarest, our recently returned exchange student and speaker today. Orion referred to him as an amazing student and ambassador for Canada.

Cole started by thanking our club for giving him the opportunity to spend about a year in Thailand, which he described as the experience of a lifetime which has changed his life forever. Cole's presentation was by video so his speaking was relatively brief. He did admit to being a bit surprised when he found it was Thailand he was going to live as he expected probably some place in the Americas or Europe.



He had some great pictures of Thailand in the video. Thailand is a small country about 75% as big as Alberta with 66 million people, most of them Buddhist (95%). He involved himself deeply in the Thai lifestyle such as riding elephants and the usual outdoor shopping.

Festivals & Celebrations are flamboyant and include many fireworks. Buddhism starts early in children's lives with meditation designed to turn lives over to their religion by age 10. School is very challenging with the day lasting eight hours and extra classes usually conducted during the evening. Classes usually have about 50 students so not much individual attention. School rooms are hot and bodies sweaty. Also the education system is not well funded by government.

The warm climate offers much outdoor activity. Food is plentiful but much different than home. There were very few foreigners in the place where he lived. The population of 15,000 contained about 100 foreigners.

Cole learned a lot but feels he just scratched the surface. His year will never be forgotten as he spent "a life in a year". Cole encouraged members to chat with him about his experiences.

Hank thanked Cole effusively and suggested the District could use his video as a training film for future outbound exchange students. He presented Cole with the usual certificate which assists a family in the Dominican Republic and also a special token of appreciation in a Chinook Rotary certificate of the 4Way Test for being such a wonderful ambassador for Canada.

In closing, Pres. Terry also thanked Cole.

Our Very Own Club Mystery

As most members know, there are 5 members that remain active in this club, that were in fact part of the founding group. We began meeting in 1976, sponsored by Calgary south and the main Calgary Rotary clubs, who had recruited each of us.

We were guided in our formation by Charter President Greg McLellan, formerly of Calgary South, to all become members of this new expansion of Rotary in Calgary. We were selected in the usual fashion, by classification "what you do, not what you are". Before receiving our charter in March of 1977, we had a very interesting group of proposed members, each from all walks of life in the zone described as our club's area. Almost immediately, I was asked to be the club historian, an assignment I have continued all these years, enjoying the advancement of the club from a historic standpoint. It has been fairly routine and we have a rich history now carefully preserved.

One of the first new members, after our charter was issued, was Dr David Chevalier, a Chiropractor, with an active practice on Elbow Drive near Britannia shopping centre. All of our charter members knew him. He, with a few others, were introduced as new members the night of April 12th 1977, at our charter night ceremony, and his photo appears in the 2nd row, 2nd from the left, in the Charter night celebration photo.

At some point the following year, we were advised that he had drowned, after an apparent heart attack, while swimming in the ocean at a resort near Can Cun. David hadn't been a particularly active member, so he wasn't really well known to us. Later we learned the date of his death was actually

February 14th 1978, while he was with his wife Bev on vacation. A plaque with his name on it is on our Memorial Recognition Board. He appears by name on our Roster Honour role as deceased 1979, which should read 1978 apparently.

Now to the mystery ...

On July 23rd 2013, I received an email from webmaster@rotary5360.org, Roger Hough, wondering if I were the Jim Thompson a Beth Anne Hughes was trying to contact about Dr David Chevalier. She stated, "My husband and I were with David Chevalier in Mexico in 1978 when he passed away." Curiosity sparked, I responded affirmative via email, knowing no other Thompsons were in our club and then things got real interesting.

Beth Anne immediately, by email, cast doubt as to how David had passed away. They – she and her husband Bill, and David and Bev – were all on the 'Isla de Mujeres', (the Island of Women) in Mexico, and she stated she had been "searching and grasping since 1978 for any obituary or any information on the death of David. David did not drown."

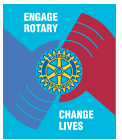
