

### SENIORS SECRET SERVICE Andrea Brumwell, Coordinator

Bart Dailley introduced today's speaker, Andrea Brumwell, representing the Seniors Secret Service group.

Andrea has worked in the nonprofit sector for the past 18 years, beginning her career with Servants Anonymous, working in both the program side, as well as senior administration and fund development. Andrea joined Seniors Secret Service in 2013, and enjoys working for this small grass roots organization.



Seniors Secret Service's mission is to enhance the quality of life for individuals 60 years and older who are alone, or isolated in the community. This group partners with seniors groups, housing facilities, outreach programs, and health care providers to identify and support isolated seniors in Calgary and surrounding areas, to ensure some of Calgary's most vulnerable citizens are not forgotten on birthdays, or at Christmas.

The Christmas Cheer program provided 2,795 gifts to 81 participating senior facilities in 2013, and the plans may exceed 3,000 in 2014. The partner agencies provide the personal profiles of the isolated seniors, who are then matched with a volunteer Secret Santa from the community. This results in a personalized gift from the Secret Santa.

The Birthday Cheer program extends the spirit of giving year round, and provides birthday gifts to seniors at 65 care facilities and senior organizations. The average cost of a birthday bag is \$20, and is covered from a budget just under \$500,000 yearly---this includes the Christmas Cheer program as well. The budget funds are raised through casino fundraisers, charitable foundations, service clubs, and individual and corporate donations.

Following her presentation, Andrea stayed to answer questions from our club members.

President Stephen thanked Andrea for her presentation with a certificate of appreciation, and closed the meeting at 1:30 pm.
