

Giving in the Aboriginal Culture Casey Eagle Speaker

Bart Dailley introduced our speaker Casey Eagle Speaker, also known by his traditional name "Sorrel Horse" by his people in the Blackfoot nation. He is a member of the Blood Tribe in Southern Alberta.

Casey provides a wide array of workshops, and in the year 2000 he was awarded the Chief David Crow Child award from the city of Calgary, as well as the Dr. Joseph Crow Shoe award from the University of Calgary for his work in Aboriginal Education.



Casey, a grandfather of twenty two, is a graduate of the University of Washington in Administration. Casey spoke about giving back to the people---a gift with conditions is not a gift. Casey was a student in a residential school, and was referred to as number 56. These scars have not completely healed.

Casey has served on several boards and committees, and has been working with Hull Services for the past seventeen years as the Aboriginal Resource Coordinator.



Following his presentation Casey stayed to answer questions from our club members.

President Stephen thanked Casey for his presentation with a certificate of appreciation and closed the meeting at 1:30 pm.
