Alberta Party Greg Clark, Leader & MLA Calgary Elbow



Today's speaker was Greg Clark, MLA for Calgary Elbow, and leader of the Alberta Party.

Greg currently serves on the Standing Committee for Resource Stewardship, and is a member of the Select Special Ethics, and Accountability Committee.

Prior to his election, Greg taught Business

Management at the U of C, and along with two partners in 2006 founded the technology firm C3 Associates which has become one of Canada's top 250 I.T. companies rated by the Branham Group.

Greg is extensively involved in community, and following the flood of 2013 he co-founded the Calgary River Communities Action Group. Greg has found the Alberta Legislature to be reasonably collegial with the exchange of ideas on flood mitigation, and the Southwest Ring Road project in Calgary, and wondered if Rotary's 4 Way Test rules could somehow apply to government!!!

Greg commented on the upcoming bi-election in Calgary Foothills, the minimum wage proposal, and general comments related to the oil industry--none of which are without controversy, but overall a wish for the province of Alberta to grow stronger.

Greg fielded a brief Q & A session before President Dale thanked Greg for his presentation.

Paul Hussey won the 50 / 50 draw once again, and contributed to the fine basket.

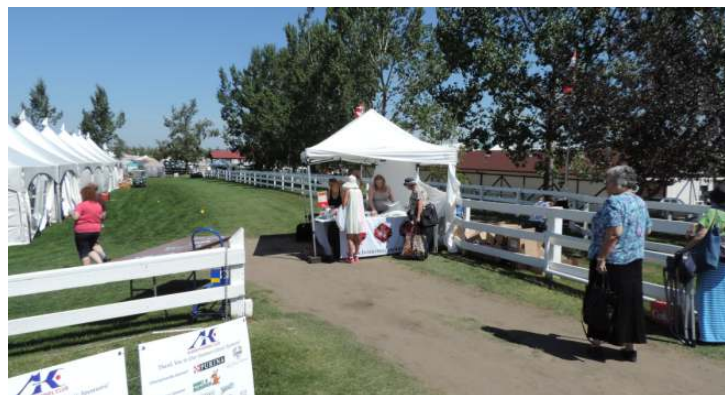

Followed the speaker's presentation, President Dale closed the meeting at 1:30 pm.

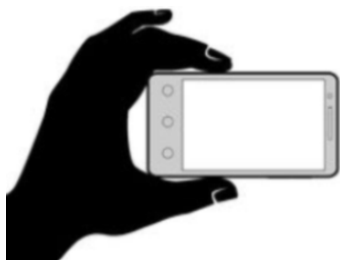

Rotary International has changed bylaws so that fellowships can grow. The section on Rotary Fellowship membership in the RI Code of policy is updated accordingly:

42.010.2. Organization and Membership

A fellowship shall have a governing document (charter, constitution, bylaws or similar document) which must be consistent with RI policy. All governing documents, and amendments thereto, must be reviewed by the fellowships committee, if practicable, and approved by the general secretary. A fellowship shall be organized with at least three officers, one of whom shall be the chair (president or other administrative head) and serve as a non-voting member-at-large of the RI fellowships committee. The chair must be an active Rotarian. A fellowship's membership shall be open to all Rotarians, **family members of Rotarians, program participants and alumni.**

42.010.17. Youth Protection

Rotary Fellowships must protect the safety and well being of all youth participating in their activities and comply with Rotary International's youth protection policies.
