# Yellowstone to Yukon Conservation Initiative Dr. Jodi Hilty, President and Chief Scientist



Bart introduced our speaker, Dr. Jodi Hilty, President and Chief Scientist of the 'Yellowstone to Yukon (Y2Y) Conservation Initiative'.

Dr. Hilty is one of World's leading experts on wild life corridors. She led the team that established the first federally-designated wildlife corridor in the United States, the path of the Pronghorn in Wyoming, and oversaw the science that saw Nahanni National Reserve in the Northwest Territories expand to more than 6.5 times its former size.

Dr. Hilty also has been co-editor, or lead author, of three recent books, most recently "Climate and Conservation: Landscape and Seascape Science, Planning and Action" (2012). She currently serves on a US Presidential advisory group role for the NAFTA North America Council.

Dr. Hilty talked about a number of species, including wolverines, grizzly bears, and pronghorn antelope, the fastest animal on North American continent. She noted that there are 650 species at risk in Canada — 40 in Alberta. and 500 in B.C. She told us that in the last 20 years, protected areas in the Y2Y, have doubled in size.

## **Polio Update**

Major changes to the polio vaccine are underway. From the 17th of April through to the 1st of May, 155 countries and territories participated in the historic trivalent to bivalent oral polio vaccine (OPV) switch. The formulation is being changed, withdrawing the Type 2 component of the vaccine. This is being done to protect future generations against circulating vaccine derived polioviruses (cVDPV).

This is the first stage of Objective Two of the Polio Eradication and Endgame Strategic Plan 2013-2018. The stated goal being to withdraw OPV in a phased manner. This is starting with the removal of the Type 2 component, following the eradication of wild poliovirus Type 2 in September 2015.

As the table below shows, "We Are This Close". With only 74 wild polio cases in 2015 compared to over 1000 per day when the PolioPlus campaign started 31 years ago.
