## **Rotary Challenger Park**

Jim Zackowski, Executive Director



President Dale introduced our speakers, Jim Zackowski, executive director, and Derek Fraser, associate director, of Calgary Rotary Challenger Park. Challenger Park is located in Calgary's North East, adjacent to the Calgary Airport. The theme of this park is a Centre for all Abilities, and is supported by the Rotary Clubs of Calgary and Airdrie, who have raised over \$1.5 million to construct the three phases of the park. The remaining founding partners are the Parks Foundation Calgary, and the Calgary Airport Authority. The Airport

Authority donated a gift of land valued at \$3.5 million. The park facilities are used regularly by more than 50 organizations supporting sustainability within our community. The Centre for all Abilities will create a permanent visual legacy wall to be a functional space in Rotary's name. The combined Rotary clubs are invited to contribute \$3.2 million over three years beginning in 2016 / 2017, and would be Rotary's next collaborative legacy project. Jim fielded a brief Q & A session before president Dale thanked Jim and Derek for their presentation, and closed the meeting at 1:30 pm.





# Hearing Loss Drs Margaret Korble and Lesley Lussier

Bart introduced today's speakers, Dr. Margaret Korble, and Dr. Leslie Lussier



from Westside Audiology. They focussed on the causes of hearing loss being conductive hearing loss, sensorinewal hearing loss, and a combination of both. A normal adult sound threshold is 0-25 DB. Some of the negative effects of hearing loss is increased anxiety in social situations resulting in increased stress. People with untreated hearing loss often withdraw from social events, and in some cases could lead to dementia. Treating hearing loss begins with an

assessment to evaluate the necessary treatment involving the different types and strengths of hearing aids available. The focus would be a hearing aid designed to fit your ear, and enough strength to be able to hear well and understand conversations in a crowded area. The average cost ranges from approximately \$3,600 upward to \$6,500 and depends upon feature content such as a volume control among others. There is some limited funding for seniors, and is also tax deductable. President Dale thanked both Margaret and Leslie for a very informative presentation, and closed the meeting at 1:30 pm.

The meeting was called to order by President Dale Perret. The singing of O Canada was followed by the Rotary Grace.



### **Rotary Employment Partnership** Alan McMillan

The program was on the District 5360 Rotary Employment Partnership (REP). The partnership focus is on Creating Employment Opportunities for People with Developmental Disabilities.

Mike Colborne of the Calgary Rotary Club is the Chair of the REP Steering Committee. He explained the structure if the Partnership. The Steering Committee is composed of one member from each of the Calgary Clubs involved in the Partnership. Their focus is identifying and working with employers (16) who are willing and able to mentor individuals who have Intellectual challenges and who are attempting to enter the work force.

Similar partnerships exist in Lloydminster, Grande Prairie, Red Deer and Edmonton. The Partnership Committees in the five centres partner up with Inclusion Alberta, an agency of the Provincial Government.
