

David Wartman, and out of town guests Rob Whitfield from High River, and Ray Roth from Canmore.


Minute People included:

OTARY INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION



Rotary Foundation

The Association of Fundraising Professionals recognized The Rotary Foundation with its annual Award for Outstanding Foundation at its 2017 conference in San Francisco. The award honours organizations that show philanthropic commitment and leadership through financial support, innovation, encouragement of others, and involvement in public affairs.

AFP's committee of judges cited Rotary's comprehensive campaign to eradicate polio as a major driver of the selection. The committee also mentioned that Rotary applies a methodical, purposeful approach to support a wide variety of causes, from providing clean water to educating the next generation of peace professionals.

"With the generous support of our members and partners, we've taken on some of the toughest humanitarian challenges in the world, none more so than the devastating disease of polio," said Rotary Foundation Chair-elect Paul Netzel. "We will defeat polio, and it will be a landmark achievement for global public health."

"This award helps to spread our belief that service to humankind truly changes our world, and for that reason, it is the greatest work of life," said Netzel.
