Help for the Highlands of Guatemala Society Bill Skinner

Peter Bickham put in a plug for the Rotary Foundations before introducing the speaker Bill Skinner from the Heritage Park Club.

Bill spoke about an ongoing project in Guatemala where he works with the local Highlands of Guatemala Society and a local Rotary club to make life better for the residents of a small village. He is known as "the giant" by the locals as he is tall even by our standards and very much taller that the locals. The women go the area are said to be the shortest in the world.



The project varies from year to year and is funded from private donations as well as from Rotary District 5360, Rotary clubs (Chinook gave \$2000)

and government matching grants. In 2016 their budget was \$52,000. Local labourers using local materials do much of the work. In recent years they have built and installed 39 biosand water filters, 51 latrines and 39 wood burning stoves. They have also provided speakers for the women's group, and made micro credit loans to help



buy such items as a loom to weave material, which is used to make cloth bags, and a loan to build a chicken coop.

For 2017, they have reduced the budget to \$18,000 because they will no longer need to install stoves or latrines in that village. They are looking for another village to focus on in the next few years.

President David thanked Bill and presented him with the usual certificate indicating out donation to Polio Plus in his name.



We are grateful for the contribution these members made in the defense of the free world and helping keep our families safe.

Our own Colonel Jim Hennessey (Ret) introduced the speaker Lt Col Ross Wickware (Ret), who began his career as a private in 1976. In 1979 he was selected under the Officers Cadet Training Plan to commence Armour Officer Classification Training. Upon completion and gaining his officers commission, he served several tours of duty in Germany, in Canada, and in the former Yugoslavia.

He retired in 1996 and upon entering civilian life became involved in several areas including real estate, software development and Internet startup companies. He also worked as the Security officer for the UN World Food Program in Afghanistan. With funding from the EU he setup a security advisory program for NGOs operating in Pakistan and Afghanistan.

Upon returning to Canada in 2007, he and his partners have created the Safety in Schools Foundation of Canada which provides safety training to high school students. In 2010 he reenrolled in the Canadian Army serving with the King's Own Calgary Regiment as well as Commanding Officer of the Territorial Battle Group. He is now retiring from the Army, again.

Colonel Wickware gave an account of his vast experiences in carrying out his dudes in the many hostile environments where he served. He believes that there is no such thing as passive

peacekeeping in today's conflict areas. The peacekeepers must enforce the peace by force if necessary, and be prepared to defend themselves with force. In many cases there is not one group against one other group, but several groups trying to gain power over the area. All of the have-not groups want to become the haves and take control. It is very difficult to win over the "hearts and minds" of the local people with people in uniform carrying arms.

At the conclusion of the talk, \$5,860 was collected from the attendees for the Veterans Food Bank. Representatives from several cubs, including our Club, announced or pledged donations to this Food Bank. A group from the Aviation Program at SAIT, represented by Ethan Gourley (Gwynneth's son and a frequent parking volunteer), is collecting for this and will pick up food if we call 403-284-7018.
