# **Dogs with Wings**Michelle Douglas, Director

"Dogs with Wings" is a leader in the international community of assistance dog training schools, providing assistance dogs to people with disabilities in Canada.

Michelle started out by introducing her fellow dog handlers in attendance today, four "puppy raisers" who brought their dogs with them to help demonstrate how well behaved even the puppies are (not a bark was heard). Normally any service dogs which are wearing their "jackets" should not be touched, however they were making an exception today so our members could interact with the puppies.



Eight week old puppies are raised by such volunteers, from the age of eight weeks to 14 weeks, after which they advance to the Training Centre for advanced

training. It is interesting to note that specific puppies are examined at the litter stage, and matched to specific families so that characteristics are matched, to advance the chances of successful training. Michelle spoke of their Autism program where their service dogs can help keep a child calm, and help stop them from "bolting" by being tethered to the dog. Two of their dogs have also been donated to the Sheldon Kennedy Centre to help calm the victims of abuse, and help them focus on their critical testimony.



Dogs with Wings is responsive to the community, adding programs and services that their clients need. Beginning in 1996, they offered guide dogs for the blind and visually impaired. In 2002, they added service dogs in response to client demand, and in 2007, they added their autism program. More recently, they have placed a variety of facility and companion dogs to clients in all regions of Alberta.

It costs \$40,000 to raise and train a service dog, including veterinary care, food requirements and training. In addition, they rely heavily on volunteers at all levels. Since 1996 they have had literally hundreds of people assisting them by fostering their dogs in training.



Dogs with Wings operates puppy programs in Edmonton, Red Deer and Calgary, and currently has over 200 active volunteers. The dogs are very sensitive (cannot yell at them) and are chosen to meet the personality and characteristics of their client. They are usually two years old when they go into service.

The dogs are not trained to come to their name ... they will look at the trainer but not come (they could be tethered to a child), and will await a further command. They use the word 'nice' to reward cont'd on page 6 ....

good behaviour (together with a treat) and 'puppy, puppy, puppy' when they are young, to come. They have three levels of sitting — 'sit', 'down' and 'all the way' — the latter when they will be stationary for some time. They also are trained to control their bathroom breaks, and will only eat on command.

The dogs are used to being in the company of people most of the time, so social training is key. They do actually get time to be normal dogs to play and exercise when their jacket is removed.
