Funeral Planning in Alberta Jeff Hagel

Bart introduced Jeff Hagel, Partner and Operations Manager, McInnis and Holloway Funeral Homes. Jeff joined McInnis and Holloway in 2007 and became a partner in 2011. In 2015, he was voted on to the Alberta Funereal Service Regulatory Board, where his is currently Vice Chair.

Jeff commented on the changes that have occurred in funeral services. One of the most striking is that over 70% are now cremations.

80% of clients have a service, which is more often a "Celebration of Life". Most include a reception afterward. Some unusual additions to services have been a Model T, and a Harley Davidson.

A measure of interest in the subject were the many questions from the members. A number of these related to cremation and the scattering of ashes. This is not allowed on public lands, or national parks. Permission must be obtained.

Sleep Disorders Dr. Paul Teman



Bart introduced our speaker, Dr. Paul Teman, a certified sleep specialist. He has a medical degree from the University of Minnesota, and a Sleep Medicine Fellowship from the Mayo Clinic.

There are many sleep disorders, with the most common being Obstructive Sleep Apnea (OSA). This is a breathing pause, caused by a relaxation of the airway. A common symptom is snoring, but now all snorers have OSA. Common causes are obesity and upper airway anatomy. Diagnosis is by sleep testing in a facility with overnight monitoring. (There are approx. 200 sleep clinics in Alberta). Testing can also be done in the home, using and apparatus which measures chest

Treatments vary, depending on severity — none, if mild; props to keep one lying on side in bed; CPAP, a machine to force air into the lungs; dental appliance, which pulls jaw forward. (There
