Our speaker, Dave Sibbald, President of Calgary Exhibition & Stamped was introduced by Jack Steen.



Dave told us quite a few things we didn't know. This whole business is really a huge community engagement by volunteers, of which they have at least 2,300 who are active.

They have a ranch for about 600 horses where they raise bucking stock for most of the rodeo

events in North America. They also have another ranch where they have 300 cows. There is also a Charter School of 300 children in kindergarten to grade 9, and soon will be adding grades 9 to 12.

The Stampede has a 20 year Master Plan and they are now 11 years in. The BMO Centre is to double in size making it a tier 1 Convention Centre. Hotels and an Opera Theatre are also on the horizon.



Last year they had over 1,800 events on the 200 acre property.



A question and answer followed:

- Yes the larger BMO centre is viable.
- Stampede and the Flames are talking about a new arena
- There are 3 active events held on the infield every year.
- Should we get the Olympics, the Stampede would be very involved as most of the space would be taken over for the 9 months before by the organizing committee.
- Yes they have Animal Rights protestors every year, but that goes with the territory, and all the animals on the grounds are very well cared for.

School's Out! - Roots 2 STEM, May 25th


The Rotary mentoring program in partnership with Fairview School, came to a close on May 25th. It has been a great year working with the students. It has made a significant difference in the life of these students.

There have been a number of projects over the year from making a working hand, architectural construction, and hours on glue guns. The final project for this year was the assembly of a robot car kit. The kits were a challenge to assemble for both the students and the mentors! The resulting robot cars can follow a line on the floor, have a sensor so they can navigate around a room, an infra-red control to provide instructions, and a blue tooth receiver as well.

It was a rush to get the final assembly of the cars done on Friday, but all the students went home with a completed robot car and an instructional DVD to learn all the control modes.

A huge thank you to Rhea Graham, John Charret, Dean White and the numerous mentors for making this year's educational partnership with Fairview school a sucess.




















The students thoroughly enjoyed the experience, and were very grateful to the mentors and the Club.


