Full Soul Project Christina Hassan



Christina Hassan is a member of the Fish Creek Rotary Club, holds a Master in Public Health degree from the University of Waterloo, and is currently a law student at the University of Calgary. She became a Rotary exchange student at 15 years of age, and then followed that up with the presidency of the University of Waterloo Rotaract Club in 2010.

During a humanitarian trip to Uganda, Christina was asked to move from her job of dispensing anti-malaria pills to helping in the delivery room of the hospital. Here she was met with the scene of a pregnant woman (Alice) lying on the delivery bed, hemorrhaging uncontrollably. All 5 hospital workers in attendance were powerless to help

this woman due to lack of medical supplies, and watched in horror as she succumbed to a loss of blood.

Through this unfortunate experience, Christina was moved to co-found FullSoul Canada, a not-for-profit organization aimed at equipping hospitals in Uganda with medical supplies to protect the health and safety of mothers, babies and practitioners during childbirth. These supplies are in the form of \$5 kits distributed to hospitals, and are paid for by a \$5,000 donation from Fish Creek Rotary, that grew to \$67,000 with matching grants, and the magic of Rotary.

Vickie Hill owns and operates the largest fullservice orchestral string instrument shop in Calgary. "V.A. Hill Fine Strings Ltd." saw it's humble beginnings in a backyard garage in the mid 1990s, to its present location at 6325 11 Street SE. She attributes her most important formula for success to "Quality and Integrity".

The youngest customer of her store was 2 years 3 months old, while her oldest customer was 81½ years old. In addition to these two, Vickie has made customers of people in the 3rd world as well as locally, in the form of donations from her inventory of stringed instruments. Her well-stocked shelves include violins, cellos and bass violins. Her staff participate in adjusting, restringing and repair of instruments which has

earned the store an A+ rating with the Better Business Bureau.

Instruments of note that Vickie displayed during her talk are a Goulding Cello circa 1785-1825 from Atlanta Georgia, Klaus Heffler Cello 2017, Thomas Cahusac 1746, Joseph Baldantoni 1837 which has an insurance appraisal of cont'd on page 3 ...

\$28,000. Another one of special note is a ¾ violin, circa late 1600 to early 1700, that was used in 1922 in the San Francisco Orchestra. This was a very sweet sounding instrument as was demonstrated by Tor Ellergardt. Calgary does indeed have violin makers such as P.M. Bell, Rob Hage and Ross Hill.

Some instruments are made from carbon fibre instead of the traditional wood. Yo Yo Mah is one person of note to own this new kind of cello. This new technology may be subject to freezing which is not allowed on wood instruments since they would be irreparably damaged. Some of the instruments on display were played by Tor Ellergardt and Velik Ho Bay, much to the pleasure of all in attendance.
