Dan joined the Rotary Club of Calgary Chinook in 2002, sponsored by Don McKenzie. He was a Paul Harris Fellow, and supporter of the various club fundraising activities.

Dan was born in Oyen, Alberta. The Great Depression forced the return to Wales when he was 13, but he never lost his love for the prairies. When Dan turned 14, he signed on with the Boys Service of the British Army. During the next 12 years he received his education as a mechanic, and served overseas during the Second World War.

Dan and Barbara were married in 1952, and in 1953, returned to Canada where they both found work in Calgary. Dan ran a Gulf service station for 14 years, then in 1975, he opened a Bumper to Bumper store (later changed to Auto Value). Dan insisted on honesty, fairness, and exceptional customer service from all who worked there.



Dan and Barbara travelled extensively. Dan was friendly and outgoing, and had a sharp and curious mind. He talked with genuine interest to all who crossed his path. He was an avid curler and skier, and enjoyed card playing. He loved Barbara dearly, and they were inseparable even after 66 years of marriage.
