Annual Dues

The Board of Directors wishes to announce that our annual membership dues will increase as of July 1st, 2019 from \$250 to \$300.

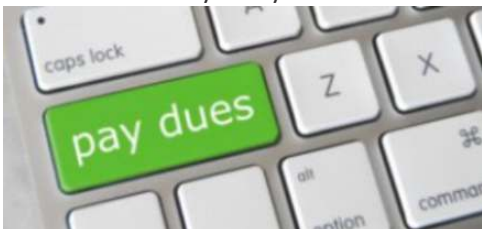
In addition, there will be a late penalty of \$50 should the dues not be paid as of August 31st.

As it has been a number of years since our dues have been reviewed, our Board looked at all the Club dues in the City, and decided that an increase is appropriate.

We initially considered an increase to \$350, however we decided it would be too much at this time.

For comparison purposes, existing dues for the Rotary Club of Calgary are \$550, Calgary Fish Creek \$300, Calgary Heritage Park \$300, Calgary South \$450 and Calgary West \$350. High River dues are \$400 and Okotoks is \$320.

The Board has enacted a policy whereby the dues are to be reviewed every two years.
