International Service Committee ReportGraham Boone, Committee Chair

Graham Boone, with the able assistance of projectionist Peter Bickham, provided a report on the activities of the International Service Committee. Chaired by Graham Boone, the committee members are Peter Bickham, Jim Hennessy, Syed Ahmed, David Irving, Neil Beatty and Sandy Swan.

The Areas of Focus are:

- Disease prevention and treatment
- Water and sanitation
- Maternal and child health
- Basic education and literacy
- Economic and community development



Over the last 10 year period, the Club has raised a total of \$991,596 through parking, casino, grilling and grants. Of this \$383,805 (38.7%) has been spent on International projects.

The list of countries supported is long, including:

Myanmar, Vietnam, Cambodia, Ukraine, Uganda, South Africa, Malawi, Dominican Republic, Haiti, Brazil, Mexico, Columbia, Guatemala, and Honduras

Graham then went on to describe the types of projects supported, including but not limited to, LED solar lighting, Malaria prevention, Micro Credit, water cisterns, and many more. He went into the background on each of the items briefly.

A great new initiative being looked into is the 'Hippo Water Roller'. It enables the movement of 90 litres of water, vs the traditional 20 litre bucket on one's head. This



saves labour time, improves sanitation and frees up time for other activities like education and micro enterprises. The UN reports that women and girls spend 200,000,000 hours every day to collect water. Diverting a portion of this time into more productive activities can only benefit society. The committee is looking into if our Interact Clubs want to get involved in this program.

Another project presented was the Hearing Assessment Project in Islamabad Pakistan. This project cont'd on page 4 ...


