Rob went into a detailed discussion of how Chinook had become coupled with the Centennial and Airdrie at Night Clubs in organizing this event as a major club fund raiser for 2019 and beyond. Rob gave us much more information and suggested more would be available on Club Runner after the next board meeting. The necessary committee structure is already taking shape. (Prepare to be asked to step up!)


George gave his "Year End Comments" which we will precis here. He spoke to the club, and thanked all the membership for stepping up and keeping Chinook out in Calgary doing its many little things from the High School Bursary program (which we started), to supporting the Interact and Rotaract clubs we helped establish. There is also our work at the Fairview School and the Mentoring program that supports it.

Many members were named specifically, especially the Board members and Paul Gaudet, Secretary, and Al Holt, Treasurer, and Directors Anne Dale, Rhea Graham, Wayne Wiebe, Jim Hennessey, Roib Wolfson and Ryan McLean, and also Bart Dailley and his unbelievable programs. Then there was mention of the Arch and Stephen and Anne, as well as George Van Schaick, photographer and the scribes. Also we have maintained a presence by financially supporting the Make a Wish Program, in Calgary.

The house committee under Paul Hussey, for its exquisite concern for detail, was high-lighted also. Paul was presented a pin in recognition of 33 years of perfect attendance.

Paul Gaudet accepted the President's pin and took over from George, with appropriate exchange of "pins".

In his opening remarks, Paul thanked George on behalf of the membership for all the time George had invested in the club



over the past year. Especially he mentioned the good leadership he has given to the Board and Club.

He then went on to delineate the items which recognized the strength of the club, such as community service at Ronald McDonald House and the Mustard Seed which will continue to grow as we take on new opportunities. Our youth programs are many including Mentorship, two Interact Clubs and the Bursary Program. Rob's Networking events provide opportunity for information sharing and new membership development. The club continues to support local community charities such as our recent \$10,000 to "Make a Wish Foundation". We continue to support humanitarian programs in Africa, Central and South America.





Paul noted our strong financial position with over \$125,000 in the bank. Then there is the proposed new fund raising event in early September, in addition to at least one other event the Board has been working on. He noted that although we do face challenges with membership and demographics the club continues to provide tremendous service and great fellowship.

Next week will be a Club Assembly at which Paul will introduce our new Board and outline more of our goals for the New Year.

This coming year's theme for Rotary will be "ROTARY CONNECTS THE WORLD".
