
Firstly, a thank you to Jim and Terry (and Faye) for organizing this.


Past President George announced that nominations for President Elect, and three Directors for 2020/21 will close November

family time, ringing handbells, playing soccer, traveling and walking "Molly" – their family pet. Dan and Marlene have 4 children and three fabulous grand children.

In 2018/2019, District Governor Dan and Marlene focussed their energies on "Club Health", and for the first time in six years, District 5360 had a growth in membership. Two new Clubs were chartered as well as one new "e-Rotaract Club". Understanding that there is still a lot of work to be accomplished, Dan has agreed to Co-Chair the District 5360 Membership Committee.

Dan took the podium first to talk about the Foundation, and announced the awards that were presented to District 5360 at our Zone 24/32 Conference in Niagara:

We were the Number One District in the World for per capita donations to The Rotary Foundation.

Marlene then made a presentation on World Polio Day and Polio Plus. She stated she was not a polio expert - but became a Rotarian because of Polio. After she retired in 2015,

she was invited on NID (national Immunization Day) to Ethiopia and it changed her life

She and her daughter Kayla joined a group of approx. 20 (US & Cdn) led by Ezra T- Seattle. They spent their first few days in Addis Ababa to acclimatize, and then had their first exposure to the devastating affects of polio. Visits were made to the Cheshire

Hospital, an assessment treatment and therapy centre. They met up with the Entoto Rotary Club and toured projects. Finally, prior to heading out on the NID, they met the WHO for a briefing and also met with the Ambassador of the USA

Then it was off to immunize. They drove to Adara (2 hours from Addis Ababa). This was a big event for the area. A rally, banners, speeches - more speeches - dancing- singing. After meeting with the health workers, who are the TRUE HEROES, they drove to the village - a scene like out of National Geographic - walking hut to hut past chickens, goats, laundry, garbage - parents welcomed us and willingly brought their children ages 0-5

On her second NID trip, Dan joined in. They met with the Canadian ambassador & President of Ethiopia- who thanked us and Rotary for helping his people. They flew to Dire Dawa, close to the Somalia border and from there travelled in UN armoured cars to a Muslim area with multiple compounds of 4-5 families. A very different experience than the previous trip.

The participation on these NID had many moments for Marlene that she related which had touched her deeply and she states have changed her life.

Paul thanked the Dohertys appropriately, by making a donation on their behalf to Polio Plus.


I am going to have the full spectrum of members take 5 - 7 minutes each to tell their Rotary story, why they are Rotarians, and what the enjoy most.
