Parks Foundation Calgary (PFC) is a private, not for profit organization that was formed with the mandate to develop parks and green spaces throughout the City. PFC is dedicated to making Calgary stand out as one of the most livable cities in North America because of its exemplary parks, protected river valleys and excellent facilities for amateur sport.

Since 1985, PFC has seen significant growth in its fundraising efforts with projects such as Griffith Woods Natural Area, Shaw Millennium Park and Calgary Rotary Challenger Park. Now, PFC is set to tackle its largest and highest profile project ever – The Calgary Greenway.



The Calgary Greenway is basically a series of connected green areas which will completely circle the City of Calgary and offer 138 km of year round outdoor destinations. It is currently well underway and has been broken down into three phases.



Launched in 2009 in partnership with the City of Calgary, the first phase of the project, called the East Calgary Greenway received financial support from all three levels of government, as well as donations from corporations, private individuals and other Foundations. This Phase is now complete and fully funded. It runs along the Northeast edge of Calgary from Airport Trail to 17th Avenue SE and showcases the Calgary Greenway's

signature 3.5 meter wide pathway, has eleven rest nodes and four major amenities along its 13 km.

Phase 2 will be 40 km from the Western Irrigation District Canal through Fish Creek Park as far as 37th Street SW. The communities of Copperfield, McKenzie Towne, Mahogany, Auburn Bay and Cranston, as well as all Calgarians, will be able to experience wetland interpretive areas, the Family Fitness Training Park and a unique dog training facility. Phase 2 is known as "the wetland experience" because of the abundance of naturally occurring wetlands in the area. The Greenway will connect these wetlands and offer interpretive experiences at each. This Phase has 22km currently under construction and will utilize 18km of Fish Creek Provincial Park.

Phase 3 is the final phase of the Calgary Greenway with 79 km completing the connection around the city. Starting at Airport Trail and proceeding

northwesterly, users will meander through the communities of Saddleridge, Skyview Ranch, Sage Hill and Sherwood, then west through Evanston, Kincora, Royal Oak, Royal Vista, and Tuscany, then south through Montgomery, Strathcona Park, Signal Hill, Springbank Hill, Discovery Ridge, Lakeview, Bayview, Oakridge, Cedarbrae and Woodbine, completing the circle at the western edge of Fish Creek Provincial Park. Users will have direct access to Inland Park, Twelve Mile Coulee, Baker Park, Shouldice Park, Edworthy Park and many others. Anticipated amenities in Phase 3 include fitness parks and interval running tracks, wetland enhancements, an active gaming playground, Greenway geocaching and a series of prairie sky viewing and information nodes.

The promotional material for this project lists "Greenway Benefits" for:

• Families – by offering free and safe recreational opportunities suitable for the entire family

• Communities – by creating places for communities to connect

• Wildlife – by preserving green space and wetlands for plants and animals to thrive

• Athletes – by developing a year-round outdoor training destination

• Schools – by creating educational opportunities through wetland interpretive areas

• Commuters – by offering carbon free transportation routes

• Dog owners – by developing fully fenced off-leash parks complete with garbage receptacles

The Calgary Greenway is a \$65 million dollar project. By bringing together partners, the project has an anticipated \$23

million remaining to be raised. The City Parks Dept will maintain the Calgary Greenway and it is noteworthy that 10% of all funds raised will be placed in an Endowment Fund held at PFC. This fund will be for maintenance over and above that provided by the City, and is designed to guarantee the Greenway remains pristine and that life cycle improvements are made.
