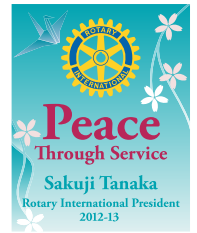

OUTGOING EXCHANGE STUDENT Cole Demorest

Orion introduced guest speaker Cole Demarest, our outbound Exchange Student who is heading for Thailand soon.

Cole's very proud mother and his younger sister were in attendance today. He made an excellent presentation outlining essentially what he will present to the Rotary club in Thailand which will be his host for about a year. His oral



presentation was supported by pictures of home, family, Calgary Alberta scenes and northern Canada and Ottawa. Also included were our national anthem, a hockey arena, and a hunting picture.

Cole enjoyed hunting with his father who passed away 4 years ago. He is an enthusiastic sportsman having played baseball, basketball, curling, skiing, snowboarding,

swimming and has gone canoeing in N.W.T. Cole also plays the bagpipes. His family is a closely knit unit. He also showed a picture of his own bedroom which looks much like a teenager's room.

He had many details of Calgary ... the elevation is 1048 m, nearly 25% of Calgarians come from another country, population over 1.2 million, wide variances in temperatures during a year, Stampede centennial with an aerial picture of the grounds. He mentions Alberta became a province in 1905 and has about 3.7 million residents, the dinosaur fossils in much of the province, the aboriginal population.

He will also present a history of the Chinook Rotary club and pictures of our Nature Park where he helped a week or so ago. In all this was a complete and interesting presentation which will inform his hosts well.

Pres. Dave congratulated Cole on his presentation and thanked him for the work he did on it.

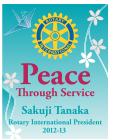

- 20 staff up at 4:30 AM to get setup
