

First up was Terry Craig's presentation on the club's new strategic plan. The plan was distributed to all members by email for their review. He highlighted the key areas of change and reviewed the process that had been used to get to this point. The plan will be reviewed by the Board at the May meeting and put in place for the next 5 years. One key aspect noted by Terry is that this is a living document, and it will be reviewed annually by a Strategic Planning Committee chaired by the

President Elect.

The second item for the meeting was the club's participation in the Rotary Greenway. President Dave Saunders first reviewed the aspects of the project and detailed the plan and participation by other Calgary Rotary Clubs. A quorum having been determined to be present, the following two motions were put forward and voted on after discussion:

the group of collective Calgary Rotary Clubs in the committing to the Parks Foundation Calgary's "Naming Rights" proposal as outlined in their attached proposal dated December 12, 2012 and that the Club will use its best efforts to support the collective Calgary Rotary Clubs combined fund raising efforts for this project.

included Dental Outreach in Uganda, Shelter Box, the Human Impact of Wildfires, and the Rotary Foundation, amongst others.


After breakout sessions, the events moved to a social at SAAG (Southern Alberta Art Gallery) followed by dinner at a variety of local restaurants.
