April 6th, 2021



ZOOM Meeting Minutes

In our last fiscal year, the total number of clients Calgary Women's Emergency Shelter served was more than 15,000.

- 1 in 2 women will experience one incident of physical or sexualized violence.
- In Canada, a woman is killed by her intimate partner every 5 days.
- Family violence and abuse costs Canada an estimated \$7.4 Billion every year.
- Calgary Police Service responds to approximately 20,000 domestic violence calls each year.

WHY VIOLENCE PREVENTION PROGRAMMING MATTERS FOR YOUTH

- Youth who experience dating violence are up to 2x more likely to experience physical, intimate partner violence later in life.
- Children who witness 10 or more incidents of parental domestic violence before the age of 16 are at least twice as likely to attempt suicide.
- Each year in Canada, it is estimated that up to 362,000 children witness or experience family violence.
- Dating violence is the highest among the 15-24 age group.
- Youth under 18 represented 22% of the Canadian population in 2004 but made up 58% of victims of sexual offences.
- 1 in 3 youth report knowing a friend or peer who has been physically abused by their partner.
- 1 in 5 girls who have been in a relationship have had their boyfriend threaten violence or self-harm if presented with a break-up.
- Approximately 19% of teens experienced dating violence in the last year



YOUR ROLE IN ENDING ABUSE

Ending family violence and abuse is a community issue and all of us play a role in the solution.

An Alberta survey showed that 90 per cent of Albertans polled believe that family violence prevention should be an urgent priority for the Government of Alberta. ~2012, Ispos Reid Survey

Learn More About Family Violence

There are a lot of myths and stereotypes that exist around family violence. The more you learn about it, the better able you are to understand the complexity and need for change. Family violence is not OK, no-one ever "asks" to be abused, and it affects everyone.

Help Someone You Know or Think is Being Abused
 If you have witnessed abuse or suspect that someone you know is being abused, help out by supporting them — let them know you are there for them.

•Take a Stand Against Family Violence and Abuse
Taking a Stand means standing up and stating that family violence
and abuse is never acceptable. This is a serious community issue.
We all have a role to play in helping end it. Help us increase
awareness and change the conversation.

Strengthening our education and awareness, along with "Taking a stand" to address this growing issue is critical. We are committed to ending family violence and abuse — we hope you will join us.

The Rotary International Convention, scheduled for 12-16 June 2021, in Taipei, Taiwan, will now be a virtual event in response to the ongoing threat of COVID-19.
