On this bright sunny, although crisp spring day, 26 Rotarians joined in over ZOOM.



Francis Akinnuoye, our own member, was our **Guest Speaker**. Francis is a lawyer, and his practice specializes in family, injury, corporate and real estate.

Today he touched on the letter P for things happening during the Pandemic.

• PROFESSIONAL SIDE: They are not permitted in the courthouse. Only in emergency situations are courts open. Sadly, this is creating a huge backlog and criminals are getting their cases thrown out.

Business has dropped dramatically as the majority don't have money to pay for a lawyer. On

a positive note, the real estate side has seen an increase of 54%. Sadly, this pandemic brings out the worst in many, and domestic violence

incidents have increased from 3,113 per year pre pandemic to a whopping 6,111.

• PEOPLE SIDE: Increase is huge in impacting mental health and substance abuse. There has been a 56% increase in mental health issues, and 21% increase in suicidal thoughts.

• PERSONAL: Francis shared why he has not been on our regular ZOOM meetings since the pandemic started. We thank you immensely Francis for sharing your story and how the pandemic has affected you personally. I think most of us can relate that sometimes you just don't feel like showing up online, pretending to smile and that all is perfect in the world. We applaud you for your honesty, and please know we are all here for support at any time.

Francis then touched on the importance of being a member of a community or group. The sense of belonging, the support and a purpose are critical at times like these. One idea for our Rotary group is to keep calling on members whose faces we are not seeing regularly at our ZOOM meetings. Sometimes just reaching out and encouraging them to sign on is all a person needs.

Stay well everyone and keep praying that an end is in sight for our return to some form of normalcy.
