Did You Know?

Jim Thompson, Club History

Did You Know? As one of the four remaining active CHARTER MEMBERS, now recognized as Life Honorary Members, I get quizzed from time to time about the club's early years. What we did to grow the membership, fellowship activities, fund raising programs, community service projects, student exchange, International RI conventions, make-up meetings around the globe etc. I have served the club as a Director, Club Secretary, Vice President, President and Past President, and chair of numerous committees.

I started being the Club Historian/Protocol Officer while as Secretary, a position I have kept for 43 years (dropped the protocol along the way). We have a remarkable collection of Past Presidents' records from the club's beginning to date, and numerous other special memoirs, club banners, awards, and photos, in albums as well as loose ones.

When people quiz me, I most often will say, why not look up what you want to know by visiting our Historic records maintained in 4 large standup cabinets, at the offices of member Moe Tynan? ... plenty of parking, sign out anything you wish to research, and sign it back in when done.

The one question I enjoy answering is "which era of the club have you found most interesting and enjoyable?". That one is easy ... the 80s. We had just begun, and fellowship was expansive — skiing trips, golfing trips, Board meetings at Board members' homes, Spouse Nights on months with five Tuesdays, Family BBQs, relocating our meeting location to the Carriage House, fun fund raising ventures, the high school debates, the avenues of service, actually followed make-up meetings locally and abroad, etc etc.

I miss our Roster, the real hard copy one with member photos, employment info, classification and spouse name, lists of past presidents and deceased active members, and our bylaws. Our last Roster like this was 2017-2018. There was one ALL clubs roster for Calgary and area produced in 1997 - 98. It must have been very difficult to assemble, lots of errors, and member turnovers a problem. I still use our 17/18 Roster kept at my home desk. We used to keep the cover, and just provide active member individual inserts annually. Ron Smith, in his time, did a super job of Roster production annually. To me it always seemed like the glue that kept us together.
