
Rob noted that today's scribe would be Paul G and asked if **we require new scribes**? Paul advised that with the new Rotary year beginning in July, we require 12 members



He opened his remarks by noting that his goal today is to provide insight into what's happening with SP. He hopes COVID precautions will soon permit us to visit their new office premises in northeast Calgary, and promises that we will be impressed. He knows something about Rotary as his dad was President of a Club in Mission, B.C.

SP is a non denominational evangelical Christian organization providing spiritual and physical aid to hurting people around the world. Some of their projects include Children's Ministries, Operation Christmas Child, Water and Sanitation, Women's Programs, and Crisis & Disaster Relief.

The majority of their activity is involved with Disaster Relief, and they stand ready to send airplanes full of assistance on a quick response basis. Their goal is to be "on the ground" at a disaster site within 72 hours of the event. They must be asked to join the relief program by the appropriate Government authority, however this is not usually an issue. They also work hard to avoid corruption on site, and are proud of their record of getting funds into the right hands, those who need it. Recently they have been active in Lebanon, Bangladesh and Iraq. They have 180 projects underway in 30 countries. In addition, they try their best to take a long term view to help the recipient countries to make sustainable changes.

Another of their major projects is Operation Christmas Child which is the reason most people know of SP. They work with public donors to prepare shoeboxes full of various items (toys, clothing, educational items) for shipment to youth around the world. More specifically, they distributed 9 million shoeboxes last year worldwide with 373,188 coming from Canada. An update during this year of COVID is that they have introduced 'build a box online' whereby one can donate funds and SP's staff will collect the items and fill the box on your behalf.

Randy then discussed the tragic situation currently occurring in India due to the COVID pandemic. India, with a population of 1.3 billion is currently seeing daily death counts of 4,000 due to COVID. SP is working with partners to send oxygen concentrators to this area, and is producing hand sanitizers for public use. They are also building facilities next to hospitals which act as triage sites, and are helping to train much needed staff for both the agricultural and health care industries.

SP is also involved with the problem of contaminated water in the third world. They have been providing 'in-home' bio sand filters

for many years, and also have designed a community sized water cleaning system (52 in use currently). Randy pointed out that 842,000 die annually from contaminated water around the world.

Randy's final update was to introduce SP's newest program "Grow Hope Campaign", whereby they will be building agricultural schools within countries in need, to train people on sustainable food production and water treatment technology. He believes that there is a massive storm brewing in the area of the food shortages in many parts of the world, which will be compounded by higher costs for what food there is. He estimates that 1/3 of the world cannot afford to eat a healthy diet, and further that 3.1 million children died in 2020 due to malnutrition. SP believes this is a long term problem best solved by educational and sustainable solutions.

Rob thanked Randy for his presentation and noted our Club's long time involvement with Operation Christmas Child (thanks to the efforts of Bart). He told Randy about Rotary's Polio Plus campaign to eradicate polio from the world, and advised that in appreciation for his presentation today, a donation would be made by our Club to support this effort.
