Peter Bickham introduced us to the AGM of our Society, advising that everything was in good order, with a quiet year being experienced year to date due to COVID restrictions.

He called for adoption of the minutes of last year's meeting. Moved by Joe Hooper and seconded by Ron Hardy, motion carried.

Next he called for adoption of the year end financial . statements (audited by Bob Gentles and Joe Hooper). Moved by

Bill and seconded by Stephen, motion carried.

The third agenda item was election of 4 Members-at-Large to be on the Society Board; Peter Bickham, Garth Sabirsh, Tammy Truman and Garth Plunkett. All elected.

• The fourth item was the election of auditors, and Bob and Joe were elected once again.

Peter officially adjourned the AGM at 12:26pm (AGM completed in just 5 minutes).



Rob asked for updates on the health of our Club and once again there were no offerings. We take this as good news and hope it continues.

Rob asked Dale to provide an update on our 'mask' order, and she advised that the initial order only included the "People of Action" variety and not the plain blue one. They have now re-ordered to correct the situation, and delivery will be held back until both varieties are on hand.

Dale then proceeded to give us an update on "ShelterBox", a charity which is supported by our Club and in which she remains personally involved. This organization was begun in 2000 in England and has a mission of providing emergency shelters to families who have lost



their homes due to natural disasters. They cover the entire Globe by working in partnership with local agencies, which provide local knowledge, and allows them to get on the ground quickly to the spots where most help is needed.

# ShelterBox provides well-constructed tents, along

with cooking and other

quality equipment to provide the shelter and tools needed to survive disaster situations. They also provide solar lights with chargers attached, which can be critical for nighttime survival. There is a great need for ShelterBox assistance around the world, especially in areas which include refugees, and Dale hopes to see our Club provide support again this year. She concluded by thanking those volunteers who help out each year with VIP parking at Globalfest, which allows ShelterBox to advertise and display their products to the public there each summer.

Tammy updated us on the subject of COVID travel Insurance. She provided an example of an actual situation where a client in his 80s paid \$225 to provide COVID insurance for \$1,000,000 to cover a two week trip to Mexico. Candidates for COVID insurance have to be able to answer 'no' to 7 health related questions (Tammy can provide the details). She advised caution before signing on with airline coverage for \$100,000 in COVID insurance.





Sved provided an

update on the on-going work for the global grant for thehearing project in Pakistan that the Club supports. He and Graham Boone will continue to coordinate this activity.

Dean provided an update on "Roots 2 STEM". They moved into new premises in June, and hosted 140 participants in

their summer camps which, while lower than in normal years, worked well with the standard safety protocols. Their mentoring program is upcoming in January so they will require volunteers to

assist the students. Those members who are comfortable and would feel safe working under proper protocols but inside, should reach out to Dean. Rob asked Dean if Rotaract students could volunteer as mentors and Dean said they could. Shirin agreed to bring up the opportunity at their next ZOOM meeting which is scheduled for next week.





Anthony reminded everyone about "Rotary Remembers" which takes place on November 11th at 10:30am on ZOOM. This is an initiative of all the Calgary Rotary Clubs, and is our way in this pandemic, of honouring our veterans who served, fought and died for our freedom. The subject of our excellent speaker this year will be "Liberation of the Netherlands", a campaign in which

Canada's role was pivotal. Please join us in supporting this event. Anthony can answer any questions you may have.

Rob presented two comedic videos and cartoons as Sargeant at Arms material; the first one from Jim Thompson entitled 'Good Deed for the Day', and the second all about wearing a mask. It's fun to break up the meeting with these smile-inducing videos!
