Calgary Airport Authority & The Mustard Seed Laura Wong, Administrative Assistant



Rob introduced our speaker, Laura Wong from the Calgary Airport Authority. Laura has supported the Calgary Airport Authority (CAA) in giving back to the community, as its Administrative Assistant, Infrastructure for the last 6 years. With a degree in General Studies and Development Art, she is passionate about giving back and developing meaningful connections with The Mustard Seed and contractors.

At the CAA, Laura is responsible for organizing team building events and celebrations, and

coordinating volunteers for The Mustard Seed. In this role, she has been instrumental in documenting and streamlining the process for volunteers to ensure they are able to build on their connections with their teams, and give back to their communities by serving a hearty meal.

Outside of work, Laura enjoys photography, baking, and learning to play the steel tongue drum.

Laura's presentation was pertaining to the CAA's support of The Mustard Seed, of which for over 2 decades, they have been a proud partner. On one day each month, CAA staff prepare and serve up to 375 meals at the Foothills location. For the approximate cost of \$2.47, they provide guests with a hearty plate of veggie, beef and macaroni casserole, salad and a bun, which has become their signature dish. In 2024, 70 members of CAA spent 360 volunteer hours, and served over 4,300 meals.

Following the brief presentation, there were a number of questions regarding the airport operation.

- Annual passenger traffic in 2018 was 19 million. Following the pandemic reduction, it was 18.6 in 2023.
- There are approximately 500 'White Hatters', who volunteer in hospitality to answer questions in both pre and post security. (See info and link on page 3.) Hank thanked Laura for her presentation and presented her with a polio certificate.
