Equally important is creating a culture of inclusion where these differences are respected, supported and valued. cont'd on page 2 ...



Inclusion: Many definitions were shared on what it means to various people but loved this quip: "Diversity is being invited to the party ... Inclusion is being asked to dance."


Rule of thumb for everyone is: Try to make things better everywhere you go.
