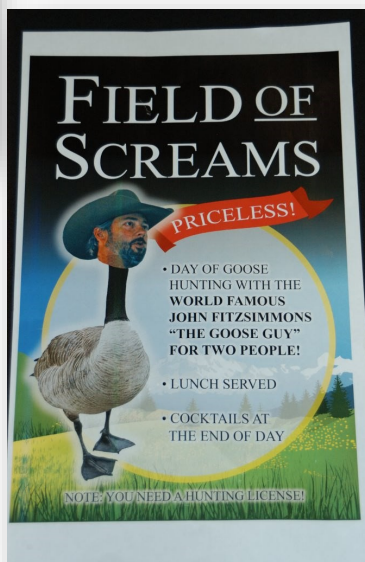

**Terry Allen** liked the set up and thought the venue was great. **Penny Leckie** commented on the great variety of items up for auction.

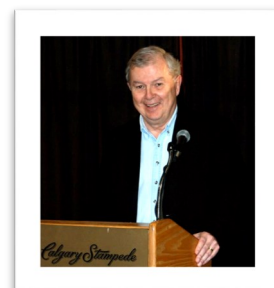
