Past President Keith Davis, on behalf of the Small Grants Committee, presented a \$10,000 cheque to Stephen McPhee & his Mom, Nancy McPhee of Stephen's Backpacks Society. The cheque is toward purchase of a badly-needed delivery vehicle.



Jim & Nancy McPhee were talking about a homeless man pictured in a Calgary newspaper. They were having a typical conversation, wondering who he was and where his family might be at that time of year. Their 5 year old son, Stephen, was playing in the adjoining room and came in to ask a question that would change their lives: "Are there kids on the street, Mommy?"

His Mother confirmed that yes there are children without homes. Stephen blurted out "Mommy, I want to help them." When asked how he wanted to help he said he wanted to think about it. A few weeks later Stephen came to his parents and said he had decided he wanted to make backpacks, a word he had difficulty even pronouncing. He went downstairs, took some of his good toys, crayons & books and brought them upstairs. Stephen's parents were excited about this, as Stephen had been diagnosed with PDDNOS on the Autism spectrum a year earlier and this behavior of wanting to reach out and help wasn't characteristic of children on the spectrum.

The McPhees went out and purchased 15 backpacks and filled them with all sorts of wonderful items. Knowing that their son was a visual learner and a very concrete thinker, Stephen's parents contacted the Inn From the Cold organization and on Christmas Eve 2016 Stephen presented his first backpacks at the shelter to a 16-year-old boy with Down Syndrome.

10 years later, Stephen's Backpacks Society has helped more than 40,000 children with thousands of backpacks, many pairs of shoes, and lots of other assistance through 4 different programs. It all started with one little boy who had the courage to dream out loud.

Rotary South, under the leadership of The Small Grants Committee Chair, Bill LeClair, are proud to be able to assist. Past President Keith also arranged for an anonymous, private donor to donate more than 4,000 square feet of warehouse space on a free, open-ended lease, providing a permanent home for Stephen's Backpacks Society and the many hundreds of volunteers who help them in their mission.
