Canadian Women for Si Women in Afghanistan Si

Janet Matthews introduced our Speaker today by saying: Today it is my great pleasure to introduce Janice Eisenhauer, the Executive Di-

rector of Canadian Women for Women in Afghanistan.

I became aware of Janice and this incredible organization when I was with the Rotary Club of Canmore, and I was very happy that our World Community Service Committee approved a \$5,000 grant to purchase "Starter Kits" each of which includes a library and science kit for students & teachers in Herat, Afghanistan.

Janice Eisenhauer is a volunteer Executive Director and co-founding member of Canadian Women for Women in Afghanistan, a non-religious, nonpolitical, federally registered Canadian charity. Over the past two decades, she has managed the day-to-day activities of the National Office, working closely with volunteer members, the Board of Directors and 20 Afghan staff in Kabul.

The organization goals are to ensure effective long-term sustainable education programs for Afghan women and their families, and to engage Canadians as global citizens. Members have raised over \$8 million since 1998, resulting in hundreds of education projects being implemented in Afghanistan. These projects benefit an average of 40,000 students annually and include the training of 9,000 Afghan teachers, setting up 250 school libraries and science labs, and funding a community girls school and an orphanage for 30 children.

Janice Eisenhauer has received many awards for her long-standing community work and volunteerism, including the 2014 City of Calgary's Signature Award for bringing international acclaim to the city, the Alberta Order of Excellence in 2015 and in June 2016, Janice received an Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree from the University of Calgary. Please help me in welcoming Janice to speak with us today.

Janice is a co-founder for over 20 years ago. There is a team of Canadians and Afghan women that work to provide better lives and op-Women in Afghanistan portunities for Afghan girls. The goals are to advance education for Afghan girls and to educate Canadians about human rights in Afghanistan.



Canadian Women for Women in Afghanistan (CW4WAfghan) is a member-based, not-for-profit organization founded in 1998 in Calgary with 800 members in 12 volunteer chapters across Canada. These members serve in a variety of volunteer capacities from leading chapter meetings, to event planning, public outreach and education, and advocacy activities. Other volunteers support the national office's activities by serving on national committees, or providing virtual volunteer services such as research and communications tasks. CW4WAfghan is a non-religious, non-political, federally registered charity.

There are 13 chapters in Canada and they each do fundraising and there is an annual symposium that highlights speakers from Canada and Afghanistan. A wonderful partnership with CW4WAghanis with writer Deborah Ellis - she has donated \$1.3 million from her book royalties.

So many stories they hear; many young girls cut their hair and wear boys clothing so they can work and help support their families. This is what keeps us doing the work we do! We have heard that Angelina Jolie is also preparing to donate royalties from her new film. March 8 is always celebrated as international Women's Day and in Afghanistan it is a big celebration now! Afghanistan is so different than what you see on the news – it is the same population of Canada with their land size the same as Saskatchewan.

In Afghanistan, the CW4WAfghan staff members, all Afghan nationals, are responsible for managing, implementing, monitoring and providing support services for CW4WAfghan's operations in the country, under the leadership of a female national Country Director. CW4WAfghan has a variety of ongoing projects each year, from schools and school equipment, teacher training, educational resources, to literacy classes, an orphanage and village libraries. These projects fall within our three field program areas: (1) Investments in Public Education; 2) Afghanistan Reads! Community Libraries & Literacy Program; and (3) Technology for Education.

A very successful initiative is the 'breaking bread' fundraiser that started 15 years ago. You invite 6 – 10 people over to your home and they pay \$75. Then you have a wonderful evening of food and fellowship! Millions of dollars have been raised!

The recent grant from Rotary Club of South Calgary, and several other Rotary Clubs in Canada and in Afghanistan, have supported the purchase and distribution of 18 school starter kits to public schools in the City of Herat. Our master teacher training team has just completed the training in this western province with a total of 1,300 teachers successfully completing their classes. A total of 9,387 teachers have completed this training in seven provinces, since its inception in 2008.

Thank you to Rotary Club of South Calgary for all you have done to fill these shelves with the promise of a better future for women and girls in Afghanistan!

You are part of a diverse and inspirational group of donors, volunteers and passionate voices speaking out for the right to an education—whose individual and collective contributions are having a profound impact. Hundreds of teachers are receiving the training and resources they need to take their students to new horizons. Library and science kits (like this one) are arriving at schools and reaching students who are hungry for learning and knowledge. A way of life is shifting.





Must-have apps

A t the 2017 Rotary International Convention in Atlanta, 10-14 June, your smartphone can help you keep track of your schedule, make social plans, and find your way around. Simplify your life by downloading a few key apps.

Start with the free Rotary Events app: Find it in your app store by searching "Rotary Events." It will let you plan your daily schedule, learn about featured speakers, and download session handouts. It also will help you connect with other Rotarians, share photos, rate sessions, and send feedback to convention organizers. The app will be available for download on 10 May.

Find out what's happening around town in music, theater, and art with the Atlanta Plantt app, which has extensive event listings. For expert reviews of restaurants and music venues, download the *Atlanta* magazine app, through which you can buy the December 2016 "Best of Atlanta" issue for \$5.99 without subscribing. That issue has plenty of tips on the best places to eat, see theater and art, and hear music.

When you venture outside the Georgia World Congress Center, take advantage of Atlanta's public transportation system, MARTA. The free MARTA On the Go app provides route schedules, estimated arrival times, system maps, and a useful feature that locates the station or stop closest to you. — HANK SARTIN
