Dana Hunter presented an overview of the Dream Home Committee's work:

"Hundreds of volunteer hours go into this project each year before a single ticket is sold.

I would like to start with a huge thank you to the Stampede Lotteries Committee under the leadership of **Lynn Grant** for the opportunity to continue this amazing partnership for the 39th year.

We are fortunate to have a number of the Lotteries Committee members in our Club, would each of you please stand and be acknowledged.

We also have 23 Committee members in this club and I have been so fortunate to work alongside them for the past number of years on this amazing project.

This year we have just over 1100 shifts to fill during stampede, several of our committee members will be available immediately following the meeting today to assist you in registering your volunteers.

The 2015 results demonstrated that the economic downturn was not a significant factor for our target buyers, we are very happy with the results and are optimistic that 2016 will have similar or better response from our buyers

We experience a 90+% volunteer retention rate, this is phenomenal and the committee would like to thank the members for maintaining a high engagement level with their personal volunteers.

DREAM HOME GOES LIVE

Key concerns are being addressed this year:

- 1. Rostering has added additional team members to provide support to the members and will be available after this meeting and every week until the shifts for 2016 have been filled.
- 2. Communications and Training sub committees are working together to update the training videos and documents and members and volunteers will receive both electronic links and hard copy documents that can be shared with their network of volunteers, additionally, we will be able to deliver the training via video in the Office for any new volunteers.
- 3. Our supplies team and Rostering team are working together to better assess the food and beverage requirements each day on park.
- 4. The Cashier team have added a 4^{th} station for 2016 to speed the check-in and check-out process.

Between the Rotary Club of Calgary South and the Rotary Partners, grants were distributed to 29 charitable organizations using the 2015 proceeds. As you know we also have several large projects on the books that are funded through this program

 - 1 for \$25, 20 for \$40, 100 for \$80
- The new on-park Split 'Em 50 lottery offers our club the opportunity to receive between \$100 and \$150K in additional proceeds.
- Ticket buyers have the opportunity to take home half the pot which is guaranteed to be a minimum of \$800,000 and can reach a maximum of \$2,000,000 if we sell out.
- The ticket bins have been moved to enclosed units so they will look different, but will all be clearly marked with the prize that corresponds.

The House is in the brand new Community of Harmony, just west of Springbank airport. This is the 21st Homes by AVI home to be featured as a Stampede Dream Home. This is the highest valued house in our history at \$924,000.

To explain more about the Dream Home, Dana introduced Christian Orme (Marketing) and Julie Punter (Interior Design) from Homes by Avi:



Christian spoke about the 20 year relationship with the Rotary Club and this year's Dream Home is number 21. He noted that the team at Homes by Avi consider three connections with the Dream Home-the winner, the Stampede and our Rotary Club. He described the location in Harmony as a master planned Lake Community with a golf course, open air museum, among other amenities. Julie Punter went on to describe some of the design features in this home to illustrate a "classic elegance with a touch of romance"

- Two large bedrooms and two full bathrooms;
- 10 foot ceilings to create volume and drama;
- Open kitchen and eating area with direct access to a 150 foot private outdoor deck
- Pocket office adjacent to the kitchen providing a dedicated home organization/tech centre;
- Whirlpool's new "White Ice" appliances;
- Double wall ovens, gas cooktop;
- Fireplaces in living room and Master bedroom.

Dana concluded the presentation by asking the question: How you can Help?

She asked **Lynn Grant** to address the Club as Chair of the Stampede Lotteries Committee. Lynn shared the great news that the advanced ticket sales were better than last year's sales as of this date and the public sales were just one day old! He urged all of us to support the advance ticket sales and recommended the Triple Horseshoe package. The free gate passes that goes along with the package can be used on the day of your shift which will save our Club money as we have to purchase the gate passes for all of the shifts, which ultimately affects our bottom line and decreases the amount of money we have to support local charities.

Dana also added that taking an active role in preparing your volunteers prior to the date of their shift will save much time and effort at the park. The Committee is preparing training information that can be shared with your volunteers and make it a much better experience for all concerned and keep our volunteers engaged.

- ⇒ Fill your 8 shifts as quickly as possible
- ⇒ If you have a question, ask a committee member
- ⇒ The Dream Home office will be located in the same spot as last year, the lower level of the Big4 building, please ensure your volunteers know where to check in.
- ⇒ The Committee is always open to your questions so don't be afraid to ask.

- ⇒ Make Eye Contact, call people over, engage in conversations, ask if they have their tickets yet, tell patrons the current value of the Split 'Em 50 pot
- ⇒ We do ask that you dress western, be as flexible as possible when you arrive, on the rare occasion that a volunteer is unable to complete their shift, it's possible you will be asked to change roles or locations.





The Greenway is truly a unique, world-class, accessible outdoor recreation facility.

On June 24th, 2017, Rotary will joyfully celebrate Canada's 150th Birthday and the legacy this 138 km system of pathways, urban parks and wetlands will provide for every citizen of Calgary and area, now and for future generations in perpetuity.




ROSTER PHOTOS NEEDED ASAP
