The Ross brothers decided to start their own brewery while attending Maryland Deathfest. In between deathmetal sets, they ended up spending a lot of time in their hotel room drinking boldly flavoured American craft beers: insanely bitter IPAS, unreal dessert stouts, and high gravity barley wines. The beers were so unbelievably good, they thought to themselves:

"Why can't we drink like this at home? Maybe we should just start a brewery that makes what we like to drink?"

In homage to their origins, the Ross Boys pair their beers with metal sounding names and graphics. New Level Brewing bends the rules of the style guidelines to create bold beers that are just a bit different from what you may have had before. They may not obey the Rhineheitsgebot, but they refuse to compromise the quality of their beer or to release any-thing that they don't love







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SPEAKER: JOHN SCOTT: FILM INDUSTRY IN ALBERTA



Ken Copithorne introduced our Guest Speaker: **John Scott**: John is an entrepreneur in the strictest sense. He is a third-generation rancher and ranches to this day. The ranch has been in his family for over 100 years. John saw an opportunity in the movie making business and he had the courage to engage in providing his abilities to be part of the development of the move industry here in Alberta. He has worked with the making of feature films – about 20 going back to 1997. John has made numerous mini-tv series like Heartland and TV films going back to 1996 along with many commercials. He was also asked to take part in the organization of



the trail drive of 200 bucking horses into Calgary for the Stampede.

John has worked with many production companies such at 20th Century Fox, Paramount Pictures, Disney and the list goes on. He first got into the industry dating back to 1970. John has worked with many animals: bear, deer, wild boar, cattle, snakes, buffalo, musk ox, camel, chimp, eagles, cats and dogs. Of course, he excels in working with and performing stunts with the horses. John is very dedicated to promoting the film and tv production business in Alberta. He has the largest collection of wagons and buggies in western Canada. John owns warehouses of props and set decorations for movies. His ranch includes 2 western towns for filming on location. He owns over 100 head of horses that are used exclusively for movies. John also has a fleet of trucks and trailers for moving animals and equipment. Welcome John!

John Scott: Thanks for the wonderful introduction and I am happy to be here! John captured the attention of everyone in the room – we were totally mesmerized by the story of his life and his work. John told us about the many movies he has made and how Heartland is filmed at his ranch. Heartland is going into their 15th year and 8 of those John was in! John has spent a lot of time advocating for the film industry to government and has seen some success with tax exemptions that have resulted in hundreds of thousands of dollars coming into Aberta, with a majority of the money being made in Calgary. Calgary is the only place in Canada that has films with the Academy Awards! The boom of the film industry has led to many jobs being created and the ripple effect of businesses working hard. This is good for Alberta.

John has worked with big name stars like: Brad Pitt, Clint Eastwood, Dustin Hoffman, Morgan Freeman, Roy Rogers and many more. When the chuckwagons were cancelled at the Stampede, John hired at least 10 of them and their teams to work with him in a variety of ways.

"Things are looking bright and I am happy to bring you a good news story! This industry shows off Calgary and Canada to the world. Thank you for having me!"

Jim Hutchens asked if the editing happens in Calgary. Answer: Mostly now, but some in Vancouver too. Jim also asked if John had a need for a short, stocky Scotsman – and **John said yes**! *President Craig noted to John that Jim was already the body double for Brad Pitt! (*

Ken Copithorne thanked John for a very entertaining talk. There is so much experience it is hard to put it in a short time. John is modest, but he is recognized as someone who thinks outside of the box. He is a stuntman, actor, trainer and such a great person. We know you are busy so thanks for making time for us.
