Kaylee is curious about the world around her, and she is also very excited and proud to share her own Canadian culture with those she will meet on her exchange in Spain. Please welcome Kaylee Quinney!

Kaylee Quinney: Our outgoing student shared a presentation with us that she will be able to use when she is in Spain this next year. She titled it "Vida En Canada" ("Life in Canada") and proceeded to show her "familia" (family of 5), her dogs and her "amigos".

Kaylee highlighted her "comunida" (community) of Chestermere and her school of St Gabriel Archangel. She is involved in many things, including tae kwon do and painting.

She is a proud Canadian and Albertan, noting the Calgary Flames, the Roughnecks and the Calgary Stampeders as our premier sports teams. She also noted the largest outdoor event in Calgary: the 10 day Calgary Stampede.

Symbols of Canada she will share with her Spanish friends include Tim Hortons, Poutine, the Beaver and the beloved Rocky Mountains.

In 1976 they moved to Calgary where John attended SAIT, graduating from the Architectural Technologies program. John earned awards for architectural design and served as the student representative for ASET during this time.

After graduation John worked for the City of Calgary, Nu-West Homes, Springer Development, Darrell Swanson Architects and Laird Polson Architects before accepting a position in the SAIT Planning & Development offices as Manager of the Design team. While at SAIT John earned his Certified Facilities Management designation and was recognized with a BOMA and a SAIT leadership award. In 1997 John moved to U of C where again he instituted many new initiatives in Facilities Management and Development.

In 2001 John started his own company Tumbleweed Projects specializing in contemporary homes, many of which are in the Springbank area. The Fellows spend a part of their winter at their home in Cabo San Lucas area. John also does charity work rebuilding homes that have been destroyed by hurricanes. John and Mary-Lou have a daughter (Shannon) who has blessed them with two Grand-daughters Hannah and Peyton. Before adjourning President Chas noted that it was his 64th birthday next Thursday but didn't want to have that event distract us from the program and to just carry on as if nothing was happening.

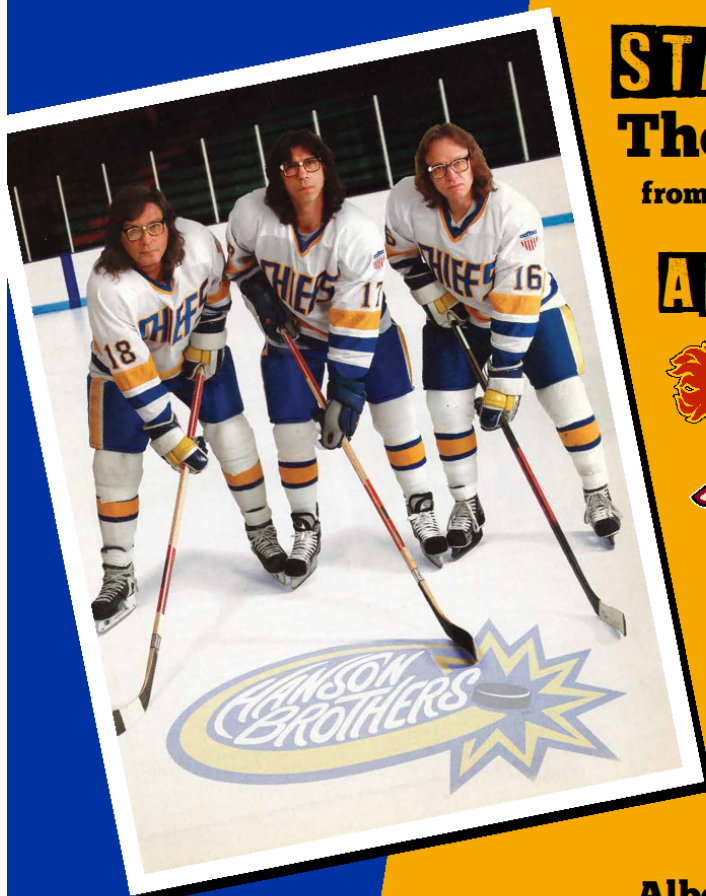

As a result they decided to advocate for a Peace Park between the two countries. As a result the Waterton-Glacier International Peace Park was created, the first such designation in world.

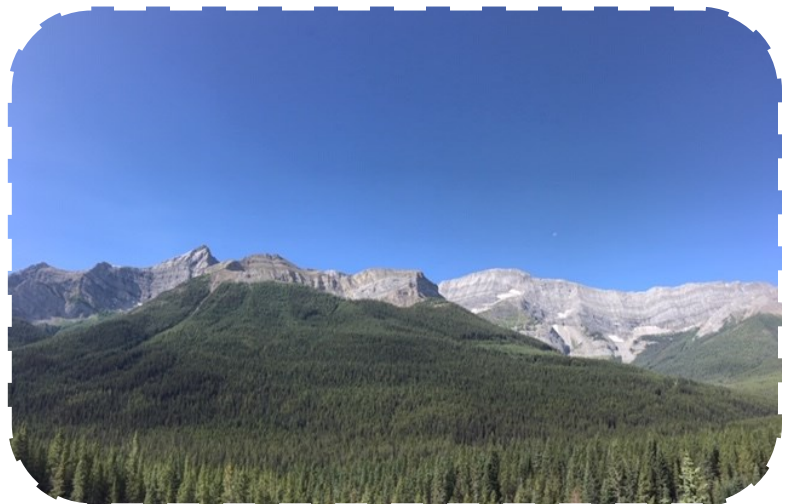
