President Bill LeClair welcomed everyone to Mount Royal University, Riddell Library and Learning Centre and introduced the **University Librarian, Carol Shepstone** to welcome us before we set off on a tour of the facilities.

Carol said they were thrilled to welcome our Rotary Club to this brand new and still unfinished facility. This has been a 10 year plus project from the time they made it a capital priority.



It has become a very important part of Mount Royal's development from an outstanding college to an outstanding University – focused on exceptional student experiences, innovative teaching and learning, and exciting opportunities for scholarship and research for faculty and staff".

"The Library came about through a generous gift from Clay Riddell and family and would have not been possible without cooperation and considerable dialogue with the Architects, the Builders, an amazing Library Team and the entire MRU family".

"The Library and Learning Centre has a strong focus on our students- not just the range and types of spaces for student studying and learning- from group rooms to silent reading rooms but on the opportunities we have created for students to be active learners and researchers. We have maker space, immersion and visualization space, audio and media creation spaces All of these spaces combine the tools, the information resources and the support of expert Library staff for students and faculty to engage discover and learn"

Carol mentioned that we were the first group to meet in the Library but will certainly not be the last. She said that this was a Community facility and they were busy planning partnership with many groups to bring their programming to the building.

These are some of the interesting and innovative spaces we visited: Maker Studio, Group Study Rooms, Standing and Treadmill Desks, Visualization Classroom, Skateboard Wall, The Sandbox, Audio Production Rooms, Library Collections, Immersion Studio, Fireplace Lounge, Curriculum and Children's Literature Collection, Performing Arts Studio and the Blackfoot Language Signage

We then left in about 6 groups to tour the space. Words do not work that well so I recommend you take in all the great shots that **Clive Pringle** took today.

QUAM BENE NON QUANTUM

One of the most important principles of a modern library is a continuous cycle of the creation and dissemination of knowledge. This includes information in all forms.

Step back. On the exterior of the building, binary code spells out "Quam bene, non quantum," Mount Royal's latin motto meaning "How well, not how much." Each column represents a letter as a series of dots and voids. They are the conversion of text to digital form, a testament to the rich history of text and print and a nod to our exciting algorithmic future.

This nearly 16,000 square-metre, four-storey stand-alone LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) gold-certified building is designed to meet the varied needs of our students, faculty and community.

The transparent design allows four floors of natural light and inspiring views, including iconic downtown Calgary, natural foothills and mountain vistas, a bustling central campus green space and the beautiful new Taylor Centre for the Performing Arts.

Modern architectural design results in a unique and stunning building, making this the academic heart of the University and an illuminated beacon for the campus.

This recommendation would take effect when our current Rotary House is demolished for redevelopment of 17th Ave SW.

Resignation: It is with regret that the Board accepted the resignation of **Stephen Cobb**.



Bylaw Changes: President Bill turned the floor over to **Sherry Austin** to announce a Bylaw amendment.

A couple of Bylaw changes were required as a result of a review of our Bylaws regarding our involvement in Gaming proceeds during Country Thunder. These are now being reversed. Please see Page 4 (next page) for further detail.

Rotary International Convention: President Bill asked **Craig Stokke** to bring us up to date on Calgary's bid to host the 2023, 2024 or 2025 Convention. **Craig** told us that as well as Calgary, Singapore, Warsaw, Dubai and Gothenberg Sweden are on the short list for those years.

A delegation from RI visited earlier this month and reviewed the Calgary facilities. This included meetings with the City, Transit, COP, the Stampede, Calgary Tourism and a visit to key venues including Banff. While we have some deficiencies in Hotel space and large Convention facilities we have a great International reputation as a host city. A decision is expected in early October and we are all rooting for this event to come back to Calgary.

Craig was thanked for all the effort he put into the bid and in turn he thanked all the members who helped the Committee with hosting the RI delegation.

Proposed New Member

Please be advised that **Chad Hason** has been proposed for active membership in the Rotary Club of Calgary South by Ken Copithorne and George Deegan with a proposed Classification: **Brand and Marketing Strategies**.

On August 21, 2017 Chad's membership was approved by the Board of Directors on the basis of the recommendations of the Membership, Qualification and Classifications Committee subject to completion of a formal application and communication of his name and proposed classification to the membership.

Proposed Bylaw Amendments

Sherry Austin, Chair, Club Handbook Development and Board Continuity Committee announced to the membership that on August 21, 2017 the Board of Directors approved the following proposed two changes to the Club Bylaws as last amended on January 19, 2017:

Article 3 – Election of Officers and Directors, Section 2 – Criteria, Directors, Paragraph (a):

"Is a member of the Club. It is highly recommended that the nominees have a minimum of 3 years in our Club."

This paragraph has existed since it was amended January 19, 2017 to accommodate the requirements of the Alberta Gaming and Liquor Commission with regard to our anticipated involvement in the Country Thunder project. The Board propose a return to the previous wording as follows:

"Has been a member of our Rotary Club for at least three (3) years."

And

Article 14 –Amendments

"These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting, a quorum being present, by a two-thirds vote of all members present, provided that notice of such proposed amendment shall have been **mailed** to each member at least **twenty-one (21)** days before such meeting"

The Board propose a change to this wording to better accommodate today's communication standards as follows:

"These by-laws may be amended at any regular meeting, a quorum being present, by a two-thirds vote of all members present, provided that notice of such proposed amendment shall have been **electronically mailed** to each member at least **seven (7)** days before such meeting."

These proposed changes will be put to the membership for approval by a show of hands at the September 14, 2017 regular meeting of the Club.
