

## A quick recap from Ken Farn's presentation last week with photos included.

**PP Ken Farn** an important Club project history milestone is highlighted that goes back over 60 years! When we were still Manchester, we donated money to build the baseball diamond, field house, stands etc. in Stanley Park, The Little League teams played there. Just this month the Calgary team won their championship there and are going on to the worlds! In 2013 when the flood happened, the whole baseball area was in ruins. In 2016 the organization began rebuilding and in doing so wanted to acknowledge our Club for all we had done for them. George Adam was the only remaining member of Manchester and they did talk with him.















## Guest Speaker:

## Bryan Walton introduces our speaker, John Barlow.

John was elected as a Member of Parliament to represent the federal riding of Macleod June 30, 2014 and was re-elected in 2015, 2019 and 2021 where the riding changed its name to Foothills. He currently serves as the Vice Chair of the Standing Committee on Agriculture and Agri-food and Food Security and is the elected Chair for the Canada-Scotland Parliamentary Friendship group for the 44<sup>th</sup> parliament. John previously served as Shadow Minister for Agriculture and Agri-Food as well as

Interprovincial Trade and Employment, Workforce Development and Labour.



John grew up in rural Saskatchewan and raised a family in southern Alberta. Before being elected to office in 2014, John had a 20-year career as an award-winning journalist with the Calgary Sun, High River Times and served as the Associate Publisher and Editor of the Okotoks Western Wheel. John and his wife Louise have 3 children (Graeden, Kinley and McKenna) and they live in High River.



## John Barlow:

Thanks so much for having me back to talk with your Club. Food security affects all Canadians and in fact everyone in the world to some degree.

We are the guardians of the grasslands. The natural grasslands in Alberta are endangered in the eco-system. We all take for granted that the grasslands will always be there.

Food security is #1 in the world issues right now – some have lived in food security issues for decades. Length of wartime is always the unknown or when it may happen again. War puts extreme pressure on an already existing challenging sector. We work hard to feed the world – but, we also need to remember to feed our own citizens.

Canadians now have a better understanding of food insecurity since COVID. However, Canadians need more education about the process from farm to plate and how it 'just does not happen'. We all have an important role in educating ourselves. The economic development of putting the food on the table is very complex and involves thousands of people to make it happen.

Environmentally Canada leads the world regarding efficiency. We have significantly reduce our carbon footprint while needs keep increasing.

Some wins that the Official Opposition have had recently:

- Changes to the tax regime for generational land transfer to family.
- Eliminated toxin in farm fuel.



- Stopping the government putting labels on basically anything with trans-fats, sodium or sugar. But our global partners became very unhappy and with the lobbying that was done by Canadian members the bill was dropped. As was the decision to label beef and pork. We must keep our eyes open though as these issues come around often.
- And a current bill on the floor is trespassing on farmland. This came about due to protesters welcoming themselves to barns and causing risk to livestock and themselves.

Fertilizer mandated reductions are currently being challenged. If the government proceeds with their planned reductions it will cause significant reductions in yield for the farmers. We need to have guidance based on science.
