Ribbons for Peace: Len Hamm and Corinne Wilkinson: Len announced the launch

of the Rotary Ribbons for Peace fundraiser. He stated that it was imperative that we not become complacent as a society with the events that are occurring in Ukraine. Every day there are approximately 50-75 Ukrainians flying into Calgary, often with only the clothes on their back. The need is very great and it is anticipated that Calgary may expect to receive up to 30,000 more evacuees. We have partnered with the Calgary North Club to make a difference in the lives of the evacuees who will become contributors to our city and country. The blue and yellow ribbons will be available for a donation of \$100. Corinne talked about the evening event that will also be a fundraiser to support the evacuees. The event is on October 12 starting at 6 pm at the Polish Canadian Cultural Centre. It will include dinner, entertainment and a live auction. Special guests include former Premier of Alberta, Ed Stelmach and his wife Marie. Tickets are \$175 and a table of 10 for \$1750. There is also an opportunity to be a sponsor for the event Contact Corinne, Murray Flegel or Larry Kennedy to discuss or reserve your sponsorship.

Induction of New Member: Alan Tennant

Len Hamm introduced Allan to the Club.

Alan has over 37 years in real estate and has served as the President and CEO of the Calgary Real Estate Board since 2011, representing more than 6.,600 real estate brokers and associates. Alan has also served as President for both the Canadian Real Estate Association and CREB.



Alan has been honored for his dedication to community service. He is the recipient of the Queen's Golden Jubilee Medal and was named Airdrie Alberta's volunteer of the year in 2005.

He comes to us with a lot of Rotary experience as a former member of the Airdrie Discovery and Downtown Clubs.



Greg Martin did the formal induction with a shoutout to Al King who helped to craft the formal induction presentation.



Alan commented that he already felt welcomed here and thanked Len and Lorna Hamm for their encouragement and mentoring (Having Len and Lorna as mentors is a great way to be introduced to our Club!). He looks forward to meeting others and working together. **Welcome Alan!**





Introduction of Main Speaker: Past President Chas introduced President Jim and noted his significant role as the

Chair of the CRCF. He also commented that the inaugural speech of the current President is a very personal statement of what is being planned in their Rotary year in order to make the Club better. Chas finished his introduction with a George Friedman quote saying; "leaders inherit the decisions of their predecessors, and current circumstances."

Inaugural Address by President Jim

Jim continued the Presidential comparison from Chas and started with a review of President Harry Truman and why he liked him as a role model for his Presidency. He was known for his pragmatic and efficient management of Government and Military Finances during the war. He was a Missouri farm boy known for being a skeptic and pragmatist. Jim said "He is known for ending the war (dropped the A Bomb), and winning the Peace (Marshall Plan) and his well known phrase "*The Buck Stops Here"*. I like Harry."

Jim outlined 3 topics for discussion: Governance, Management and a Go Forward Plan.

Regarding Governance: The Board of Directors has ultimate authority and accountability for the management of our Club. Committees cannot act independently of the Board. Any suggestions, concerns from the Committees should go to the relevant Director as a first level of inquiry, then onward to the Chair of the Board, if required.

Regarding Management: Committees have been reduced from 72-40. Many outlived their purpose, and some had overlapping of functions. Fewer committees, fewer silos, more engagement. "More Rotary-less meetings" is the goal.

Costs have been reduced over the past 2 Covid years. However, there is no getting around the costs of running a big, highly regulated business. Our Club has the good fortune of lots of charity funding for this year which supports the goal of "More Rotary-less fundraising". Funding requests by the various Committees need to be into their respective Director by November 28, 2022.

4) Raise the profile of Rotary and our Club in the community: Craig Stokke: consolidated & focused communications program, and ; P3: all key Club partners know us on 1st name basis and are fully engaged.

5) Improve internal communication: Craig Stokke & Board: communications plan is successful when members stop complaining about it.

Jim finished his presentation by getting all Directors Stand. 5 Officers. All have smiling faces. President is Chair of the Board (me) and ultimately responsible – *"The Buck Stops Here"*




HIKING CLUB


