President Chas opened today with the following remarks.... Fellow Rotarians and friends, we have an extra special program today. We will once again, through our partnership with The Calgary Stampede and Stampede Lotteries receive a cheque for our efforts of this past summer as part of the Greatest Show on Earth!

Now, we have been presented with cheques before. All of them extremely important as they have turned out to be the backbone of our ability to be the premier fund-raising Club certainly in Western Canada and well beyond. However, it is a little more special today as we will for the first time ever accept these funds under our new Club name of *The Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park*.

We sit here in this log cabin that was built by our Club. It is a beloved meeting place and perhaps the most unique to be found. It is certainly the most envied. We have chosen to adorn and surround ourselves with the most important reminders of what we believe Rotary embodies.

Our original Charter hangs nearby our Past Presidents' Wall of Fame many of whom are literally a who's who of Calgarians that have had a profound impact upon the City of Calgary. We also note all Club contributors to the Paul Harris Fellowship on the opposite wall. These photos are a testament to the continued pledge to enhance the Rotary reach. All worthy notations that endear and connect those that came before to those that lead the way.

In light of our agenda today; I want to take notice of another very special item we place in permanent display in our cabin.

As one of the first items you see, the plaque on the wall commemorates the vision a few past members who along with visionaries from the Stampede and Lotteries who launched our Dream Home Project. It enhanced our long association with the Stampede from building our clubhouse on these grounds to fortifying a partnership that continues to enhance our great City.

With hard work, vision and yes, a little luck, we along with our partners Calgary Stampede and Stampede Lotteries have enabled the original concept to grow to unimagined importance.

Now we strengthen that partnership through our Legacy project and the introduction of our new club name. I know I speak for the membership when I say we are excited to begin this next chapter in the life of our Club and the Calgary Stampede. For a bit more on our new name I want to call upon **Past President Sherry Austin**.

Sherry provided an overview of the process we went through in trying to get our name changed and the interaction with Rotary International on this matter. She read the following excerpts from our letter to the Stampeded Board when we were advising them of the proposal....



"We are proud of our association with the Calgary Stampede and remain your dedicated ambassadors. We admire your vision and enduring commitment to connecting humanity to the rural and agriculture world beyond urban centres. We would like to continue to grow and strengthen our partnership through shared ideas and strategies as we believe we can do more for others through our combined synergies.

In summary, our Rotary Club would be most honoured if you would support our name change to the "Rotary Club of Calgary at Stampede Park" to reflect not only our long time location but, most importantly, to highlight our long time partnership with the Calgary Stampede and more recently the Calgary Stampede Foundation. We share a legacy of dedicated community service over many decades. Our Rotary motto of "Service Above Self" could easily describe the Calgary Stampede as well".

Sherry also gave a big thank you to our guest today, **District Governor Christine Rendell** for her help in navigating through Rotary International.

President Chas then called on **Jim Bladon**, Chair of the Dream Home Committee.

Greetings from the Dream Home Committee. The Dream Home Journey for 2019 started 12 months ago (Nov/Dec 2018) "Do we do E tickets? Do we try on one of the games...or all?" This was the big question posed at the Calgary Stampede Lotteries Committee (CSLC) meetings. This was recognized to be a huge undertaking.

Jan 2019, Feb, March passes and we still had no formal approval to proceed. In the meantime on our end we were trying to figure out the implications for scheduling and volunteer jobs for the coming event.

April came and in early May it is a go but a Work in Progress. This was now a joint effort with the Lottery Committee, the Kinsmen and ourselves and included all the Lotteries. The system was being designed and developed but by our first training session with our partners on June 3rd it was far from complete.

One month later and we had over 500 Kinsmen and Rotarians trained on the new processes and how to work the Tablets. Someone asked: Is a tablet like a smartphone? But everyone, young and older than young quickly picked up on the technology. The Rostering launch was 6 weeks late. Yet we filled over 1000 shifts in a week. On park after the first night we had NO issues! And the results speak for themselves with record sales and a record year of support for our Charities. Thanks to every Rotarian, Partner and volunteer, with a special thanks to Craig, Dana, John Shield, Kevin MacLeod and all the others on the Committee. Please stand and be recognized by the Club!

Jim then introduced **Ed Gordon** who is the Current Chair of the Calgary Stampede Lotteries Committee. Ed thanked Jim for his introduction and mentioned that he has just finished his term and **Jason Azmier** is taking over next year.

Ed is a Kinsmen and he recognizes the contribution that the CSLC make to the Community through both Clubs and the Stampede Foundation. He said that the e-Ticket initiative happened because a group of believers stepped up and made it happen. Kinsmen and Rotary volunteers and Stampede Staff made a 5 year project happen in 6 months. And 2019 was the biggest year yet! Thanks again to all involved. Ed invites all the Rotary Chairs along with our members on the CSLC to the front and he presented the Club with a Cheque for \$666.630.00



Warren reminded us that the first Dream Home cheque was \$42,000! We have come a long way together. He was honored to be here today and hear the story of our name change. The relationship between the Stampede and Rotary is unheard of and it is a relationship that the Stampede and the 50 some charities we support hold near and dear.

Give yourself a big hand.

President Chas then gave the floor to **District Governor Christine Rendell** for her closing remarks.





"Rotary connects the world and this Club makes a big impact, setting the tone for all the Clubs in the District through our Dream Home Project. So I would like to thank all of you for your continuing effort.

A Special Thanks to Sherry Austin particularly now when it was 30 years ago that Women were first admitted to Rotary. Christine presented Sherry with a pin marking the occasion".


