It was a great day at the Feed the Hungry on December 9th.

A meal of Turkey, roasted potatoes, peas, carrots, salad and dessert was prepared by 25 volunteers in the morning. In the afternoon 75 volunteers plated and served the meal. Front door guests were 293 plus 221 family members (about 60 families). This is way more families that we usually serve. The draw of course was Santa. The families had their pictures taken with Santa. Each family received a Christmas gift courtesy of Heninger Toyota.

We prepared meals for 800 plates and served 1071. Most had seconds. We ran out of food. The chefs quickly prepared some meat balls for the remaining guests. We served a lot more meals than in prior years.

Our club contributed \$5,000 to cover the cost of the meal plus we provided all of the volunteers. Great work. We are scheduled for Sunday November 24, 2019. Thanks to everyone who helped out.
